

Ordinance No. 62.

Annual appropriation ordinance for the municipal year commencing May 1, 1895, and ending May 1, 1896.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of the city of Red Cloud, Ne-

Sec 1. That the following sums be appropriated to the following purposes: For sidewalks and streets, in

addition to the poll tax.....\$ 240 00 For coal...... 1000 00 For maintainance of the poor .. 200 00 For repairs of water system.... 204 00 For official salaries.... For incidentals, stationery, &c .. For payment of bills of preceding year, fer which no warrants have been drawn.....

For water commissioner, enginee;, and labor on the mains The bills of last year referred to are

and the salary of engineer. Sec. 2. Said sums shall be appropria-

those incurred for maintainance of poor

ted out of the following funds: The salary of water commissioner, engineer, and expenditures for repairs of system and mains, shall be paid out of the water rents and charges. The residue Special reduced rates and excursion of said fund if any shall be used for purchase of coal.

Expenditures for streets and sidewalks shall be paid out of the occupation tax, and the residue of said fund shall be used for the payment of coal bills, including drayage and freight charges for the same.


Official salaries, maintenance of poor, payment of last year's bills provided in section one, and incidentals shall be paid ont of the general fund. Enough warrants shall be drawn on the general fund to pay any residue of coal charges not paid out of occupation and water

Interest on bonds shall be paid out of

their respective bond levies. Sec. 3. Any moneys that may be paid to the treasurer from the levies of previous years, after the warrants of those years have been paid, and any moneys or funds not otherwise appropriated by this ordinence. shall be appropriated for the payment of outstanding accounts for which no warrants have been drawn other than those mentioned in section one.

Sec. 4. The several funds with the amounts appropriated are as follows excepting interest, funds and debts:
