Death of Samuel Pettit.

The Signal is again called upon to chronicle another frightful accident whereby a well known and highly respected citizen of this community is suddenly and without moment's warning removed from his family and friends forever.

Mr. Samuel Pettit, a farmer about six miles southeast of Guide Rock, had been doing some trading in town last Wednesday, and about four o'clock in the afternoon started for home. He was driving a team that was hardly considered safe, and was in a light buggy without a top. When within a mile of home his team took fright at some school children and started to run and were soon absolutely beyond his control. When nearly opposite the home of his brother, William Pettit, and as he was approaching a very bad piece of road leading into a ravine, he either jumped or was thrown from his buggy, falling on his head and crushing his skull. William Pettit, who was at work in a field near his house, ran to him and with others who came to his assistance soon removed him to his home. Physicians were hastily summoned but at once saw that his case was hopeless and at about 7 o'clock breathed his last, not having recovered consciousness after receiving his frightful fall.

The funeral took place on Friday, the services being conducted by Rev. Hummell of Red Cloud, assisted by Rev. Potter and Rev. Shanell of this place. The United Workman and comrades of the G. A. R., of both of which orders deceased was a member, also took part in the ceremonies, and all that was mortal of Samuel Pettit was followed to the tomb by the largest funeral procession we have ever witnessed in this country—Guide Rock Signal.
