





WEATHER FORECASTS.

Furnished Expressly for The Red Cloud Chief.

(Copyrighted, 1896, by W. T. Foster.) St. Joseph, Mo., Jan. 4.-My last bulletin gave forecasts of the storm 13, cross the west of Rockies country by close of 14th, great central valleys from 15th to 17th, eastern states 18th.
