



St. Joseph, Mo., Jan. 17.—My last bulletin gave forecasts of the storm wave to cross the continent from Jan. 19th to 231, and the next will reach the Pacific coast about January 21, cross the west of Rockies country by close of 25th, great central valleys 28th. eastern states 29th.

With the close of this disturbance repetition of that strange experience to the cold part of January will have passed, the last part of the mouth and the first week in February being designated in the forecasts as a warm period.

The warm wave will cross the west of Rockies country about 24th, great central valleys 26th, and eastern states 28th. Cold wave will cross the west of Rockies country about 27th

As an average of the whole country this disturbance will bring less rain thought that life had something stored and snow than the preceding storms of the month and the first disturbance of February will be of the dry kind.

Readers may have overlooked the significance of the terms cool wave and cold wave as used in these builetins. In the winter months the former is used for the warmest part of the months and the latter term for the coldest part. All close observers of the weather have noticed that the cool or cold part of the month continues, not always, but usually from ten to fourteen days and then is succeed. ed by a warmer period of a similar duration. I use the term cool wave to designate those periods that average warm for about two weeks and cold wave for the corresponding cold part of the month.

These periods do not run by month and the warm periods may cover part of two months as well be the case with the last part of this and the first part of next month, The cold period also sometimes covers part of two months as will be the case with Jul, DEAR SIR: I am able now to give you and August of this year.


