And have received the following replies, which go to show that the people of this city are dead in earnest in regard to something being done for the advancement of the interests of our city.

Such being the case, it only remains for our people to get together at once and organize the club and proceed to get Red Cloud before the world in the proper manner.

There are many things of public interest that should be looked after at once, and only a united people can do that very thing, which is so necessary at this time for the salvation of our city.

A commercial club, officered with our most enterprising men, would go far toward putting the city on its feet. It is a lack of union that has put us where we are today. If we had had a commercial club to look after matters, no doubt but what we could have prevented the removal of the last batch of railway men to other places, which has just taken place.

Then there is the "good roads subject" that would be advanced by the club; "the bridge question;" the repairing of the sidewalks; and, in fact, all public matters that concern the city could or would be looked after by this club.

Through this club, Red Cloud could be thoroughly advertised in the east, as could be Webster county, in which we are as much interested as we are in our city.

The club would be purely for the benefit of the city and county, and would at all times be ready and willing to take hold of any project that might come up for consideration. In this club we want only such men as will contribute of their time and means to the upbuilding of the city, and are in real earnest in regard to its welfare. "Push, energy and pluck" must be the motto at all times. We can not afford to have men sulk in their tents when they should be at work helping to advance the interests of Red Cloud.

A public mass meeting should be called at once by the mayor for the speedy organization of this club, so that a protest might be entered at once to the B. & M. headquarters against the removal of their employees from this city, and every business man and citizen should be present to sign a remonstrance to that effect.

The time is now opportune for this movement and all should grasp it and set Red Cloud on the top wave, and traveling men say that this is the best city in the valley for business, and that we do more business than many of the other cities in the state twice as large. We all know that, and therefore let's try to increase it the coming year.
