valleys 10th, eastern states 12th. GENERAL FEBRUARY WEATHER.

The Missouri valley, the Mississippi valley above St. Louis, Manitoba, Lakes Michigan and Superior, will average below normal temperatures, the coldest parts being a line drawn from Winnipeg to Kansas City.


The Pacific slope, northern parts of the southern states, the Ohio valley, lower lakes, and the north Atlantic states will have about average temper-

The southern parts of the souther states and the south Atlantic coast country, from Raleigh and Charleston southward, will average below the normal temperatures.

The rainfall for February will be unusually even, with excesses and defleiencies in yery few places. The average February rainfall east of the Rockies is heaviest, about six inches, within the circle running from New Orleans by way of Memphis, Nashville, Atlanta, Mobile, and back to New Orleans. All around this circle the rainfall grows less as you recede

On the Pacific slope the heaviest rainfall along the coast, about ten inches, is near Olympia, gradually decreasing southward to three inches near Los Angeles, and decreasing from the coast to the crest of the Rockies.

CONTINENTAL ARIDITY.

The Pacific slope receives its moisture principally from the Pacific ocean, where it is evaporated by the central valleys 7th to 9th, eastern dewnpour of dry air in the north Pacific perpetual high, the center of which is about thirty degrees nearly west of San Francisco.

The moisture is brought to the Pabegin the rain or snow period of the eific slope by winds whose prevailing direction on the coast is nearly paralel with the coast, and therefore all of California, Nevada, Arizona, Utah, Idaho and the eastern parts of Colordo and New Mexico must depend for sufficient rainfall largely on the condition of the countries northwest of

> Whatever will aid in holding moisture will aid in rainfall and the prevention of drouths and hot winds, and these aids must be general. The whole of the North American continent, including Mexico, must adopt similar measures before rain can be properly distributed and local drouths prevented.

Western Texas, Mexico and New Mexico receive their moisture partly from the Pacific and partly from the Atlantic, the crest of the Rocky mountain extension being the divid- Incidental ing line.

East of the Rockies the humidity comes almost exclusively from the Railroad bonds. Guif of Mexico and the Atlantic lying immediately east of it, where the sea water is lifted by evaporation and carried into the continent by the north Atlantic perpetual high.

The central path of this moistureladen air enters the continent between New Orleans and Galveston. moves by way of the Black Hills, Manitoba, the great lakes and the Gulf of St. Lawrence, where it enters the Atlantic coast.
