## WEATHER FORECASTS.

Furnished Expressly for The Red Cloud Chief.

(Copyrighted, 1896, by W. T. Foster.)  
ST. JOSEPH, Mo., Feb. 1.—My last bulletin gave forecasts of the storm waves to cross the continent from January 31st to February 4th and February 6th to 10th.

The third disturbance of February will reach the Pacific coast about 11th, cross the west of Rockies country by close of 12th, great central valleys 13th to 15th, eastern states 16th.

The warm wave will cross the west of Rockies country about 11th, great central valleys 13th, eastern states 15th. Cool wave will cross the west of Rockies country about 14th, great central valleys 16th, eastern states 18th.

The center of this storm will take a more southern route than usual, and the storm will be of very considerable force in the eastern states about the 15th, while the cold wave will, about the same time, be of unusual force in the great central valleys, particularly in the upper Mississippi and Missouri valleys. Extensive snows will fall in northern portions of the United States.

The storms of the middle part of February will all be unusually severe and cause very unpleasant weather, especially in the northern states.

Weather will be too cold for early gardening along the gulf and south Atlantic coasts of the southern states.

### ARIDITY.

The great deficiency in rainfall in 1895 has caused unusual interest in the subjects connected with rainfall. There is one universal remedy for aridity, one general cure for drouths and that is the planting of trees.

If the people of Canada, Mexico and the United States could be aroused to the importance of planting trees and preserving timber the future drouths and floods would be much less destructive. Brush lands should be left, as far as possible, to grow up in timber.

In places many difficulties, from various causes, are encountered in growing fruit trees and forest trees and for these difficulties there are two universal remedies. Undertow irrigation and the iron fertilizer will do the work.

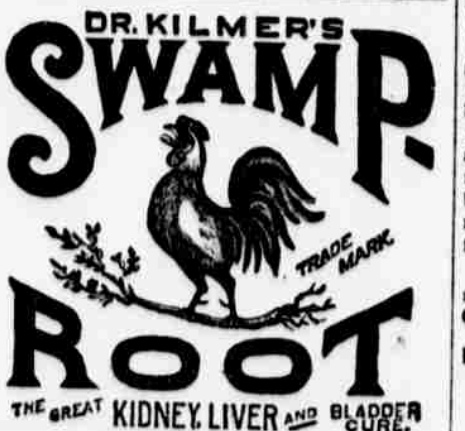
Where trees are already planted dig your ditch winding among the trees, so as to keep it as nearly as convenient on level ground making the bottom of the ditch on a water level, fill it with six to twelve inches of gravel, broken stone, brickbats or corn cobs, tamp well, and you will have one of the remedies.

A good way to tamp the soil over the ditch is to drive horses, single file, lengthwise over the ditch. Cut as few roots as possible in digging the ditch, which should be made deep enough to be out of reach of the plow. Roots of trees will grow from ten to forty feet to get to the moisture in these ditches.

Put old iron around your trees, or iron in any form that will make rust, and it will double their vigor and growth. Put tin cans around them and leave them there to rust.

Of course the iron fertilizer dug from the earth is the very best, where the mixture has the proper ingredients. There are a number of iron mines in various parts of the country but not all of them furnish the best fertilizers.

I am trying to make arrangements to obtain small quantities of the best.

fertilizer at actual cost in order that experiments may be made in various parts of the country. The value of this fertilizer will be a revelation to millions of people.

But the supply of moisture is the question hand, and as the crop season of 1896 approaches, the time is opportune for discussing this question.

The north American continent, April to October, is divided into four weather districts, each of which has its own peculiar system of winds and weather. Draw a line from Galveston by way of Fort Smith, St. Louis, Columbus, Ohio, and Pittsburgh to New York city, and all the country lying south and east of that line belongs to one system. If this system is extended, it will take in the northern portion of Yucatan, all of Cuba and the other West India islands.

For this district the prevailing winds follow the line mentioned, beginning at the southern part of the West Indies, then by Cuba, Galveston, etc., and returning into the Atlantic about New York City.

Nearer the center of this semi-circle the wind circulation is less extensive. It goes from about Key West by way of New Orleans, Memphis, Louisville, and back to the Atlantic near Richmond, Virginia. The next line of circulation is inside of the last mentioned, moving from the Bahamas northward through Florida, Montgomery, Augusta, and back into the Atlantic near Charleston, South Carolina.

These prevailing winds come from a high barometer, and therefore the air comes down from above, and, before reaching the earth, either the land or sea, is dry, cool and light, evidently being propelled by currents of electricity. This air soon becomes saturated with moisture evaporated from the seas, and serious drouths would never occur in this district if the timber was well protected, unless from causes far to the northwest, outside of this district.

This is a subject to which the people of the southeastern states should give very careful study. It is first necessary for them to put their own country in a condition not to invite drouths and floods, which will partially remedy the flood and drouth evils.

But there is another potent cause these evils which affects the southeastern states, and it is found in the arid districts west of the Mississippi.

The storm centers that pass eastward through the southern states and along the 40 h parallel, crossing the Rocky mountains not far from Denver, must be supplied with moisture. The natural source of this moisture would be the Gulf of Mexico, but this is sometimes cut off by the Arid country lying immediately east of the Rockies.

The distance across that arid district east to west is very much shorter than from north to south, and therefore the moisture for the approaching storm centers often comes from the southeastern states, thereby robbing them of that which would bring them rains, and a severe drouth is the consequence.

If the aridity of the east of Rockies arid districts was broken up, then the storm centers would not rob the southeastern states of their moisture as a sufficiency would be carried from the western gulf directly over western Texas and eastern Colorado.

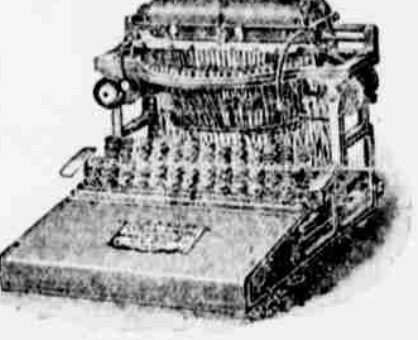
