For the Webster County Sunday-school convention.

1. Our county convention, without one predominating, definite purpose, will not be worth what it costs.

2. Without a suitable arrangement of both topics and speakers to a given end, and a sticking to that purpose, our convention will be a failure.

3. It applies to a Sunday School Convention as well as to any other christian enterprise, that the way to get a convention up is to talk it up, work it up, pray it up, and pay it up.

4. Urge each member of your school to attend the S. S. Convention this year. Make an extra effort to be present the first day and remain until the close.

5. The program committee has endeavored to arrange a program of topics carefully selected for the occasion, then selected speakers and essayists, so far as possible, to fit the topics.

6. To ask persons to speak or read an essay at a Sunday School Convention, selecting their own topic, is to belittle and degrade the convention.

7. At our semi-annual convention last September, one failed to be present who had been assigned an important topic, to carry out our program. Precious time was wasted trying to find a substitute. Do not let this occur at our annual convention; will you?

8. To be, is more important than to do, yet, being good excuses no one from doing good. Come to the convention prepared to do your part. Don't say "my name is not on the program; I am not a delegate; I have nothing to do." Look again and you may find your name between lines.

9. All will have equal rights and the same privilege in the convention, with the exception of voting; that belongs to delegates only.

10. When you get ready to start for the convention, be sure to pack your sectarianism and leave it at home.

11. If you will study and examine the program carefully, you will then be prepared to decide for yourself which day or part of the exercises, if any, you can best afford to miss.

12. Thursday afternoon will be the foundation part of our convention; let everyone be present for the opening song. Thursday evening will be a preparation of the workmen, in which all will be expected to take part. A Sunday School Rally Service; if you have never attended one, be sure to be present. I need not say come to any who have attended them, as they will all be here.

13. If there is any part of the program you do not exactly understand, it is your duty to write to some member of the committee for an explanation.

14. All work in which any considerable number of people are united must have some form of organization in order to obtain any satisfactory results. Organization condenses power, directs energy, and gives unity to work; therefore, the officers of the county work desire to get each township of our county organized with a full set of officers. Come prepared to place in nomination the very best person in your township. If you allow friendship or favoritism to be your guide in this selection, you have about one chance in twenty to select the right ones.

WEATHER FORECASTS.

St. Joseph, Mo., Feb. 22.—My last bulletin gave forecasts of the storm waves to cross the continent from 23d to 27th and the next will reach the Pacific coast about 28th, cross the west of Rockies country by close of 29th, great central valleys March 1st to 3d, and eastern states 27th.

This will be an important disturbance, of wide extent and of more than usual force. In many parts of the continent all the varieties of weather may be expected, from balmy spring days to the uncouth blizzard, the former preceding and the latter following the central dates of the disturbance.

The cold wave following this storm is expected to bring unusually low temperatures in the great central valleys that will continue through the first week of March.

The warm wave will cross the west of Rockies country about February 28th, great central valleys March 1st, eastern states March 3d. Cold wave will cross the west of Rockies country about March 2d, great central valleys 4th, eastern states 6th.

THE LONG RANGE FORECASTS.

Four times out of five my forecasts of average monthly temperatures prove correct and one time out of five there is a reversal, a repulse, a battle lost. Why? Because the system is not yet perfected.

For the Missouri, Ohio, and Mississippi valleys forecasts of January temperatures proved incorrect, the temperatures were exactly opposite what the calculations indicated. This applies only to the total monthly average. The changes within the month came about as predicted.

Prof. Bigelow, of the national weather bureau, finds exactly the same difficulty. He has a twenty-seven days period which he believes to be controlled by the sun's rotations. He found this period by a ten year's record in Europe of the magnetic forces. These forces seem to repeat themselves in about twenty-seven days and they affect the temperatures so that they repeat in about the same period.

If the length of Prof. Bigelow's magnetic and temperature period proves to be correct—there can be no doubt that it is nearly so—he would have a correct basis for long range forecasts if it were not for one troublesome difficulty.

About one out of five of these twenty-seven days periods reverses, both in magnetic force and in the temperatures and he has not, so far, been able to discover the cause.

The above will explain why about one time in five the long range forecasts completely fail as to temperatures. This, however, still leaves about 80 per cent of correct temperature forecasts.

The forecasts for rainfall, with a few exceptions were good, at least 80 per cent correct and for all, except the northern portions of the great central valleys, the temperature forecasts were good.

GENERAL MARCH WEATHER.

Temperatures in the northern portion of the great central valleys will average low. St. Louis, Kansas City, Omaha, Davenport, Chicago, Columbus, Cincinnati and back to St. Louis makes a circle inside of which will be the lowest average temperature for March and all around this center of cold, the average will tend toward warmer, reaching to above the normal on the Pacific slope, on the borders of Mexico and in Florida, and only a little below normal in the remainder of the Atlantic states and Canada.

Rainfall for March will be above normal in Florida, East Gulf states, Cumberland valley and northern part of the Pacific slope. In the Ohio, Missouri and upper Mississippi valleys, upper and lower lakes, Manitobas Red River of the North valley and the eastern provinces of Canada rainfall will be a little below normal.

The above forecasts, remember, are for the total rainfall and the monthly averages of temperature. The individual storms, cold waves and extremes of temperature will be quite a

different character and much more radical.

About the first part, middle and close of the month will occur very great extremes of weather. The Pacific slope should prepare for an unusually stormy and cool period about the middle of March. About this time all the country east of the Rockies will be subjected to very severe weather including a severe cold wave. The disturbances about the first and last parts of the month will be similar, but probably not quite so severe.

THE WEATHER DISTRICTS.

I divide the east of Rockies countries into four weather districts and the Pacific slope into two, because of the peculiar atmospheric circulation that distinguishes each from the other. Insect and animal life in each of these districts differs very materially from each of the other districts and in time the climates of each of these districts will probably produce a race of men radically differing from the races that will be produced in each of the others.

Probably the northeastern district should, for several reasons, be called the first, the east gulf states second, west gulf third, upper Mississippi and Missouri valleys fourth, north Pacific slope fifth, south Pacific slope sixth.

The first weather district covers the eastern provinces of Canada and the northeastern states of this country and its weather is governed by two peculiarities not to be found in any of the others.

One of these is the Icelandic permanent low barometer. This law is more extensive in winter than in summer. It oscillates eastward and westward at long intervals and largely affects the character of the weather on this continent. When its oscillation is westward about January the counties it covers is treated to a hard cold winter and when its oscillation is eastward in January a mild winter is the result.

In summer this Icelandic low has a decreased force and the north Atlantic high immediately south of it has its force largely increased. When it comes west a summer drought results in some of the Atlantic states and when it goes east floods substitute the droughts.

This north Atlantic high has been on a westward swing for two or three years and in 1895 it covered the Ohio valley and the eastern provinces of Canada with such great forces as to alarm all parts of the United States, as it seemed to indicate a permanent change of climate.

But it will swing back toward Europe and our climate will be restored if man will cease his robberies, restore the forests and establish other means of retaining moisture.

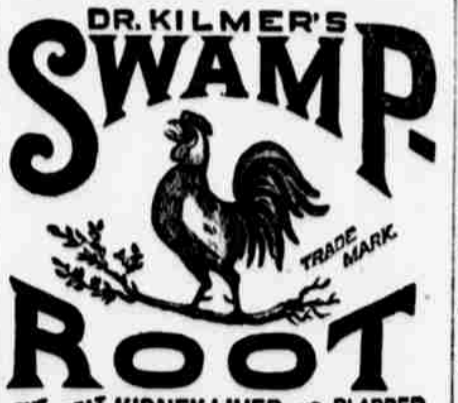
