Crop Report.

The temperature of the past week has been slightly below the normal in the western portion of the state and a little above the normal in the eastern.

The week was generally dry until the rains were general in all parts of the state excepting the extreme northeastern and southwestern portions. Over most of the southern part of the state from two to three inches fell.

The dry weather early in the week was very favorable in the progress of corn planting and most of the crop is now in the ground. Some of the early pl anted is six inches high and much of it has been worked.
