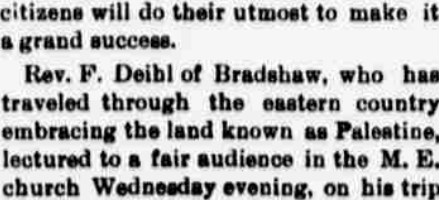
Correct time at Penman's. J. L. Miner and Geo. Con returned on Tuesday morning from an extended journey in the west.

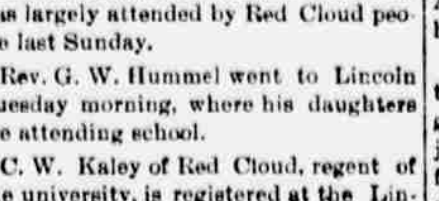
