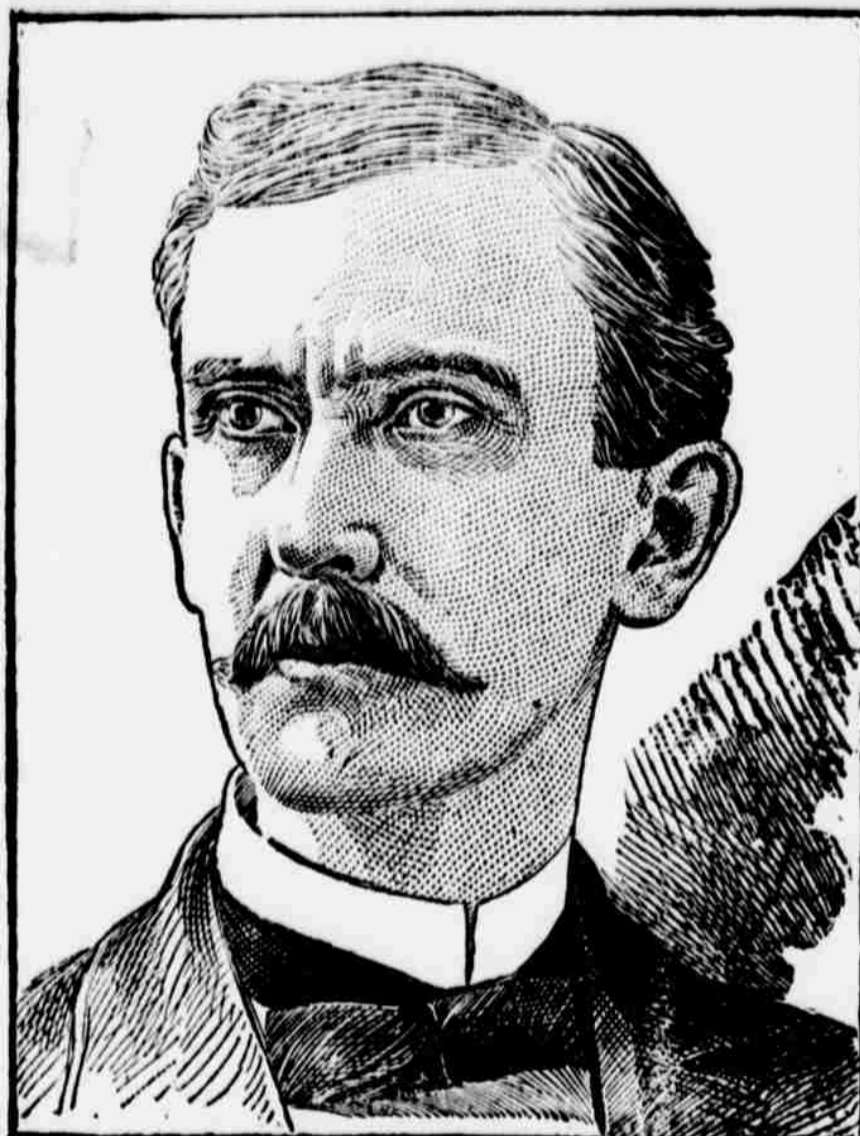


MAJOR W. W. ROBBINS.

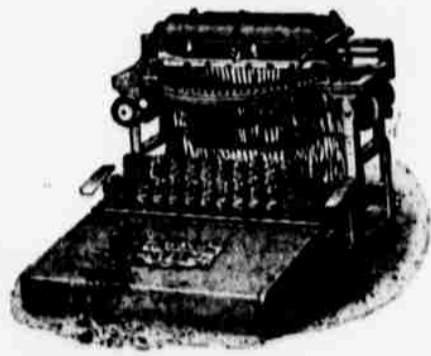

The First Session of the Fifty-fourth.

That nothing of particular value has been done by congress during the present session is no fault of the republican majority in the house. That body has shown its good faith and has endeavored to correct the present condition of the treasury and has passed a revenue bill that ought to have been acceptable to the democrats in the senate and to the president and his cabinet, as it was a "tariff for revenue only" so far as the present abortion, the Wilson Gorman law, was amended. It was short and easily comprehended and would have relieved the government from bonding the country in another \$100,000,000 as the alternative to the suspension of specie payments and the holding up of treasury warrants.

In refusing the country this much needed relief the administration and its party has crowned its pyramid of blunders and leaves its work of disgrace and dishonor complete in every particular. There was no other pressing matter for attention and failing in this, the republicans in congress have transacted the routine business of perfecting and passing the appropriation bills and is ready to adjourn.

To their credit in a negative way may be added the prompt defeat by their votes of all further attempts to destroy the credit of the government by the passage of free coinage of silver bills passed by the senate and their squealing of the bill prohibiting the president from issuing bonds for the protection of the gold reserve and incidentally carrying on the government.

The object of this bill was two-fold, apparently. First, to force the country to silver monometallism by the cornering of gold and gold notes and the defrauding of the 30,000 officers and employees of the federal government of part of their pay until the treasury should be a year or so hence replenished by a republican congress and president.

The appropriations have been made with tolerable economy, considering the success of the democratic and pop majority in the senate in loading the house bills up with additional items. The much needed appropriations for coast defenses had for the main part to go over on account of the destruction of our revenues under Grover's administration. We shall have to take our chances of war until after another election.

Poultry on the Farm.

The following paper was read by Mrs. Rose S. Carr at the Jasper (Illinois) County Farmers' Institute:

No branch of agriculture is so universally underestimated as poultry. I might quote, in proof of this assertion, statistics from our large cities in the United States, but I think it will, perhaps, be of more interest to tell what I have been able to glean in regard to the money value derived from the poultry yard in Jasper county alone for the year just closed.

I have experienced great difficulty in procuring reliable information from the farmers themselves, because of the lamentable fact that so few of them keep a record of their work. The habit of guessing is supposed to belong strictly to the Yankee, but it is far too prevalent among farmers, and the rule with farmers' wives, to which I have found no exception.

Guessing has long been discarded by the commercial world, but the farmer and his wife have not dispensed with it, because they do not consider themselves business people. Well, they need not regard themselves so, nor should they be so regarded by others, until they adopt business methods. The record for my own flock, (I confine myself in this paper to chickens alone, as time will not permit my talking on different varieties), is: Pure bred Plymouth Rock hens, seventy-five; males, two; eggs, \$37.63; chickens, \$27.04. Total, \$134.66. Eggs used, 1495; chickens used, 45; stock on hand, 17 hens.

There is quite a good deal of what approaches to nonsense written now and then, in these days, about the formation of nitrates in the soil, their fixation by the root nodules, etc. What is wanted when a green crop is turned under is to get it decomposed as soon as possible; this will be accomplished more rapidly in warm than in cold weather. In the South there would doubtless be much warm weather after the pea crop was fully matured but in the Northern states not. The recommendation to cover with lime is often made, and is good, so, too, this crop the use of super-phosphate (acid phosphate is the same thing); and it is right, also, to say that, if green manuring accomplishes nothing more than to plow under green stuff to make humus, it is only a part of what should be done; this is the case when rye or buckwheat is used; but with the pea or clover fertilized with phosphate, nitrogen is gathered from the air, and a large quantity of this most valuable plant-food may be added to the soil, besides a much larger quantity of humus-making material than the most luxuriant crop of rye or buckwheat would yield.—New York Times.
