SERMONETS.
"If Christ is not risen, then is our preaching vain, and your faith is also vain."—1 Cor. XV:14 The Apostle Paul represents the resurrection of Jesus Christ, or a fact of fundamental moment to christianity. Christ himself attached no less importance to it. The church, from its founding to the present day, has regarded it as a matter of most most momentous consequence.

In our discussion two weeks ago, it was shown that modern scholarship, both of Europe and of America, had pronounced the new testament, in general, the work of Christ's apostles and of his immediate followers; that even the most radical and antagonistic critics conceded that the gospels of Mathew, Mark and Luke were written before 70 A. D., and that Romans, I and II Corinthians and Galatians were written by Paul about 56 A. D. In other words, these new testament writings are pronounced genuine history. Herein are those things which honest men claim to have seen and heard and believed.

One event to which the new testament writers bear unanimous testimony is the resurrection of Jesus Christ. While it is not directly stated that Christ rose from the dead in the short epistle of James and of Jude, it is nevertheless clearly implied.

Paul says in I Cor. XV that Christ appeared after his resurrection, (1) to Cephar, (2) to the Twelve, (3) to more than "five hundred brethren at once, of whom the greater part remain until now," (4) to James, (5) to all the apostles, (6) to Paul himself.

Thus we have in the account of the resurrection of Christ, a stubborn historic fact; one which can no longer be explained away by discrediting the New Testament as genuine history. Attempts however are made to explain away the fact of the resurrection, and next week we shall consider some of these attempts.

You will observe that I have not attempted to defend the resurrection by a reasoning from analogy; nor have I urged the acceptance of it by faith. The chief evidence to a true christian is not that which comes as an historical or scientific fact, but the evidence which the Spirit of God bears to his inner consciousness, an evidence which makes the christian certain that Christ lives and that the records of Him in the New Testament are true. A mystical evidence, you say. Yes, but none the less certain because mystical.

My purpose in showing the historic fact of the resurrection and of the genuineness of the New Testament books is to supplement faith with intellectual fact, to assist those who have intellectual difficulties, and to meet skepticism on a purely intellectual basis.
