WASHINGTON NOTES.

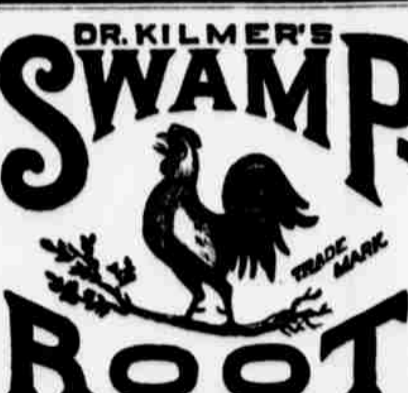
So far as the work at the Washington end is concerned the presidential campaign is over. There is no longer any bustle around either the Bryan or the McKinley headquarters. The work of sending out campaign literature is ended, and if any votes are changed between this time and election day it will not be because of anything done in Washington. The fight is now transferred to the voting precincts. While there is less hysteria displayed at Bryan headquarters than was on tap last week, the democrats and populists are claiming that Bryan will certainly be elected by a small majority of the electoral college and that the silver men will elect a majority of the next house.

At McKinley headquarters, they are actually jubilant in their confidence that McKinley will receive the 325 electoral votes claimed for him by Vice-Chairman Apsley, of the republican congressional committee, or more, and that the number of republican members of the next house will not fall short of 224 claimed by Mr. Apsley. Outside of the political headquarters the impression has been growing in Washington for some days that McKinley will win, not by so large a vote as Mr. Apsley claims, but still that he will win. So general has the idea become that most people speak of it as a matter of course, and nine men out of ten taken at random on the street and asked who they thought would be elected replied without any hesitation "McKinley," and yet a majority of these men were for Bryan. During a period covering five presidential elections, I have never known the opinion of the result of one of them to be so nearly unanimous in Washington. This is, perhaps, largely attributable to the wish of ninety per cent or more of the government employes that McKinley will win, but it isn't all chargeable to that, as many who think that McKinley will win do not wish him to do so. But whatever the cause, the case is just as I have stated it.

President Cleveland has a nice juicy plumb to give to somebody in filling the vacancy on the court of claims caused by the death of Chief Justice Richardson. This is a lifetime job that at least two members of the cabinet—Wilson and Herbert—would very willingly drop into, and one of them may get it, but threats have already been made by the silver men who are in a majority in the senate, that no gold democrat will be confirmed if one is nominated to the vacancy. It will be a comparatively easy matter to hold up any nomination made until after the 4th of March if any number of senators desire to do so.

It is thought by Georgia men in Washington that the death of ex Speaker Crisp, who would have been elected to the senate will precipitate a red hot fight for the seat in the senate which Gen. Gordon will vacate next March. That ex-Secretary Hoke Smith would like to be senator, is well known, but his financial views will probably put the prize beyond his reach, as the legislature is overwhelmingly for silver, and Mr. Smith, while supporting Bryan and the Chicago platform is virtually doing so under compulsion. Gov. Atkinson, whose home popularity has just been attested by a re-election, is believed to have the best chance for the senatorship.

The members of the administration are swiping Bryan and silver every time they can. Secretary Morton made the price of wheat the basis for a statement showing how prosperous our wheat growers are under the gold standard; Secretary Olney's department has made public a statement, said to be a summary of consular reports, showing that wages in the gold standard countries are better than they are in countries which have the double standard, and other things favorable to gold and unfavorable to silver; Secretary Carlisle is on the stump; Secretary Herbert, ditto; Postmaster Gen. Wilson has made one speech against Bryan and is expected to make others; Secretary Francis has written a letter calling Bryan and what he stands for some very hard names; Attorney General Harmon it will be remembered did the same thing sometime ago.
