EARTH CRACKS OPEN.

Serious and Alarming Disaster in Bohemia Account of Strange Phenomenon.

A remarkable disaster has occurred in the old German town of Brux, in northwestern Bohemia, in many respects recalling the recent disastrous earthquake which almost entirely destroyed the town of Laibach, in Carniola. On Friday evening, writes the Vienna correspondent of the London Times, the inhabitants of Brux were alarmed by the sudden extinguishing of the street lamps, and at first it was surmised that an accident had occurred at the gas works. The report, however, spread that a large number of the houses in the Bahnhofstrasse were in imminent danger of collapsing, which was shortly after confirmed and supplemented by the news that the "Anne Shaft," belonging to the Brux Coal Mining company, in the vicinity of the town, had been completely flooded by an inrush of sand and water. In consequence of the reports the authorities took immediate steps to clear the houses in the Bahnhofstrasse of their inhabitants, and it is owing to the promptness with which precautionary measures were adopted that the subsequent series of disasters was attended by comparatively slight loss of life.

The horror of the situation was greatly increased by the total darkness which prevailed, together with a heavy downpour of rain. The descriptions of the scene which have reached Vienne are heartrending in the extreme, the panie-stricken, half-ylad inhabitants crowding the streets, not knowing in what direction to fly for safety. Early in the morning, in view of the danger which still threatened, the authorities ordered the clearance of the houses in that part of the town which has suffered most severely. Up to the present eighteen houses are in ruins and it is expected that many others will have to be pulled down. The damage is estimated to exceed 1,500,000 florins. In consequence of the breaking of the main gas and water pipes the town is without light and water. The distress which prevails is very great. During the last sitting of the reichsrath the government was called upon to take prompt measures to alleviate the distress, and in view of the magnitude of the disaster to make use of the funds at its disposal for such purposes to assist the sufferers. The money thus expended by the government will be voted during the next session.

TOO MANY BOOKS.

Market Reported Badly Overstocked-Number of Cooks Produced Last Year.

During 1304 the number of books pub ished in this country, as given by the Baltimore American, was 3,507, or, induding new editions of old books, L474 This was a considerable falling off from isid, when the new books numbered 25t, or, including new editions, 5.15t. The decrease was evidently owing to the hard times, for when depression somes one of the first manifestations of economy is in cutting off the purchase of books. It was also true that the printing of books had been very largely overdone. Of every fifty published, it is safe to say that not more than one is worth reading. The figures for America are large, but they are larger in England, while France remains the great publishing center of the world.

The old question as to where the pins go is almost repeated in the books and papers and periodicals. For some time recently the cheap publishers from piles for forty years and from bave been turning out volumes by the itching piles for twenty years and two million, and it is possible to purchase cents. 
