One of our bright exchanges thusly comments on the question of burning corn for fuel: "Many a man would hold up his hands in holy horror at the idea of burning corn for fuel, notwithstanding it might be economy to do so in the West this year, has perhaps been guilty of a good deal of useless burning of corn all the years of his experience as a farmer and feeder of live stock. The ways and means of doing this are numerous. It is no more nor less than the burning of corn from his cribs for the farmer to act niggardly in the feeding of animals that should be pushed forward rapidly in the making of flesh milk, wool, or what not. It is burning the farmer's corn to feed it to poorly bred animals, or such as can give but a poor account of it. It is burning his corn to attempt to make feed take the place of shelter. It amounts to the same thing when the farmer becomes wasteful in his methods. A poorly balanced ration is one of the most common ways of burning corn right out under the farmer's nose. Even in this year of plenty when there comes up the question of the propriety of burning the corn for fuel it may be a most appropriate time for a careful consideration of the whole question of wastfulness as hinted at in the foregoing."




