The civil service rules may be likened to a punching bag in a public gymnasium, and the senators and representatives to the punchers. Whether they can punch the bag to pieces is yet of the civil service under those rules, but that isn't going fast enough for some of the opponents of Mr. Cleveland's numerous extensions of the rule, and Representative Corliss, of Mich., has offered a joint resolution providing for the repeal of every extension made under the last administration. Mr. Corlies tried to get immediate consideration for the resolution, but Speaker Reed would not have it that way, so it has gone to join the numerous bills and resolutions which are awaiting the appointment of the house committees.
