Experiments have proved that three drops of the liquor that accumulates in the bowl of a pipe will kill a rabbit in nine minutes. A drop of pure micotine inserted near the conjunctive of any small animal will kill it almost instantly; eight drops will kill a horse, giving him frightful convulsions. If one drop of the stuff would give a man convulsions one day it would take two the next. four on the third day, etc., which shows how readily the system adapts itself to poison.—St. Louis Republic.

March, 1897. The republican majority in the next Ohio legislature, as shown by the returns from Ohio, insures the retirement of Senator Brice (dem.) and the succession of a republican. It appears to be settled that ex-Gov. Foraker will be the choice of the legislature, as the state convention placed his name in the platform as the senatorial candi-

In Maryland the election of a republican legislature, the first in many years, will bring about the retirement of Senator Gibson and the election of POLNICKY, Proprietor. a republican in his place. The election of a republican legislature in Iowa was not unexpected, and it is considered settled that Senator Allison will be elected to succeed himself.

The return of a democratic legislature in Mississippi has been a foregone conclusion. It will elect a successor to Senator George. The returns from New York and New Jersey indicate republican gains. These legislatures do not elect United States senators this year, but, as part of legislatures hold over, the present election is important in influencing these bodies which will elect successors to Senator Hill, of New York, and Senator Smith, of New Jersey, whose terms expire March 4, 1897.
