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WASHINGTON NOTES.

The events of the past week have made it as certain as any political event in the future can be that the tariff will not figure as an issue in the next national campaign, and perhaps never again. The cause of this is the adoption of the republican policy of protection by a considerable portion of the democratic party, while many populists have always believed in it. True, the democratic senators who have voted for protection do not all call it by that name, but that is immaterial. They have voted to put a protective duty upon the products of their states, and they have done so because of the wishes of their constituents. In those states there can be no tariff issue, when everybody favors protection under some name or some form. The silver men have seen this thing coming for some time and have encouraged it, because they think it will have a tendency to make the money question the overshadowing issue of the next campaign, and they think that is what they want.

There is much comment upon an amendment to the sugar schedule of the tariff bill, offered by Hoar, because it is regarded as an acknowledgment that the criticisms of the new sugar schedule, which only get a majority of 2, although it was voted for by the two Nevada senators and by Senator McEnery, of La., have not been without effect. Senator Hoar's amendment provides for the appointment of a commission to investigate the conditions of the sugar growing and refining business of the U. S., and report to the next regular session of congress what the duty on sugar ought to be to enable the sugar men to make a reasonable profit and at the same time to make sugar raise its share of revenue. One trouble about Mr. Hoar's amendment even if it were adopted would be the doubt as to whether a commission would be any more successful in getting accurate information about the sugar trust, which practically does all the sugar refining in this country, than members of congressional committees have been. Upon this the entire sugar schedule of the tariff bill hangs. If the figures presented by the framers of the schedule are correct, the protection for the trust would not be exorbitantly large, but it was openly stated by the opposition, and not denied, that the figures were prepared by the sugar trust, and other estimates prepared by outside experts showing the protection to be three times greater than it is claimed to be, were presented to the senate. The trouble is in getting at exactly how much raw sugar it takes to make a pound of refined sugar and what the cost of the process is. The process used by the sugar trust is a secret one, said to be known only to a few of its most trusted employes.

Two hundred and fifty millions of dollars is an enormous sum to add to the gold money of the world in a single year. Such a production has never been accomplished and until recently nobody thought that that sum could be produced in a year, but late reports from the mines in South Africa, and Central and South America, Australia and our own country all show such rapid gains as to lead to the belief that the gold output for 1897 will be nearly or quite 250 million dollars, far exceeding any previous year in history.
