

**County Commissioners.**  
An adjourned meeting of the board of county commissioners of Webster county, Nebraska, met Tuesday, August 17, with all members present.  
F. E. Payne appeared and asked the board to reconsider their action in regard to the road in Catherton precinct as prayed for by Hans Skjelver and others. The board decided they had no jurisdiction in the matter.  
J. G. Sharp represented to the board that during the summer of 1896 he worked out the railroad tax in the several road districts in the county and that during said year the county failed to make a levy for road purposes in said county, and asks the board to reimburse him for the amount of said work performed. The matter was referred to the county attorney for his opinion. County attorney took the matter under advisement to report Wednesday morning.  
In the matter of the renting of the poor farm for 1898, now comes O. E. Ramey and makes application to rent the west half of the northwest quarter of said section less about five acres, leaving about seventy-five acres under cultivation, for which O. E. Ramey agrees to pay \$1.50 for each acre he cultivates on said west half of northwest quarter.  
Board adjourned to meet Wednesday August 18th, at 9 a. m.

Board met Wednesday morning pursuant to adjournment with all members present.  
D. Ramey presented his opinion regarding the road tax worked out for the year 1896 as follows: "In the matter of the road tax for the year 1896 it is my opinion that all parties who worked out three-fourths of their land tax for that year should receive credit therefor from their respective road-oversers on receipts issued in 1897."  
The following order was made: "It is hereby ordered and the road-oversers of Webster county are hereby instructed to credit all persons who worked out three-fourths of their land tax for the year 1896, on the receipts issued during 1897 to the extent of the amount worked."  
In the matter of the petition of F. W. Ailes and others asking for the construction of a bridge across Lost creek on the section line running north and south between the north-west quarter of section twenty-six and the north-east quarter of section twenty-seven, town one, range ten, the prayer of petitioners was granted.
