

Section 61, Penalty; If the owner of any swine or other domestic animals dying from cholera or other domestic animals to any person shall sell or dispose of the carcass of such swine or other domestic animals to any person for the purpose of manufacturing the same into scap or rendering the same into lard or for other purposes, or if any person shall buy or otherwise obtain the carcass of any swine or other domestic animals dying from cholera or other disease for manufacturing purposes as aforesaid, or any other purpose except that of burial or burning as provided in the preceding section every such person shall upon conviction be fined in any sum not less than twe my five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars or to be imprisoned not exceeding six months.
