Water Dairying. The situation in the dairy line may be greatly helped by progressive dairymen making winter dairying their principal line of work.

The men that must begin the winter dairying are our most progressive men, the men that have silos, or at least that know how to provide their cows with succulent food in winter and feed in a way that will keep up a constant flow of milk.

One objection to winter dairying has been that it requires too constant work, the sowing of special succulent crops in the spring and summer, the gathering of them in the fall, and the care of the milk and butter and their sale in the winter, making twelve months of work.

Some use the argument that if all ranch winter dairying there will be no profit in it for any one. That is a contingency that need not be guarded against. Winter dairying is too much like work for everyone to run into it.
