Whether that intervention will result in war is a question upon which different opinions are held by men equally competent to judge.

Instead of trying to make political capital out of the attitude of the administration toward the De Lome incident, as many of his party colleagues are doing, Senator Gray, of Delaware, a prominent member of the committee on foreign relations, is trying to allay public excitement by expressing such opinions as the following. "It seems to me that the president has acted with great dignity in paying no attention to the opinion concerning him which he found in the letter. He could not take cognizance of it without making himself a party to the theft, for, it must be remembered, this letter is a stolen one. As to the utterances of the minister, which indicate that Spain is using autonomy and reciprocity as pretexts, I should say that they must be regarded in the same light. We cannot afford to base any complaints of this government on an incident which is the result of do so, we countenance the crime and make ourselves a party to it. The U. S. is such a big and powerful body that when it moves something has to give way. Naturally, therefore, we should not move unless there is something at stake-something more important and serious than a personal opinion expressed in a private communication ruptious means. 
