How Display Figures for Stores Are Made.

THEIRS FOR 500 YEARS. Farm in Norway Owned by One Fam-

ily Since 1381. J. E. Sogard received a remarkably interesting document from Christiania, Norway, and one which he prizes very highly. It came from the government museum at Christiania, and is an exact copy of two deeds of very ancient date. the original deeds having been preserved and placed on exhibition in the museum. The deeds are for a certain farm which the Sogard family has possessed for centuries and upon which two of his brothers-Simon, of Webster City, and John, of Iowa City-were bore. The first deed is dated July 1 that, or more than 500 years ago. A better realization of the age of this cord is now when it is remembered that the Sogard family was in possession of the farm more than 100 years before Columbus discovered America, and it is probable that their ownership dates much farther back than is shown by this deed.
