Saturday's issue of the daily publication of the department of state known as "Advance Sheets of Consular Reas "Advance Sheets of Consular Reports" is devoted entirely to the Phillipine Islands, which are about ten per cent larger in area than New England, New York, New Jersey, Maryland and Delaware combined, and which have an estimated population of from 8,000,000 to 10,000,000. But probably the most astonishing thing about this publication, to most people are the official figures showing that the United States has more commerce with the Phillipine Islands than does all the rest of the world combined.


