#### District Court Proceedings.

First National Bank of Omaha vs. State Bank of Blue Hill. Suit on note. Plaintiff given leave to file amended reply instant. Case set for trial May 5.

Muscavite Mortgage Co. vs. C. W. McDonald, I. A. Reneau, et al. Suit on contract. 40 days to amend petition. 30 days to plead.

John W. Moon vs. Isidore Freymark, consolidated with City of Red Cloud, Nebraska, vs. The Michigan Trust Co., Executors, et al. For receiver. Continued on court's own motion.

Douglas J. Myers vs. Geo. L. Gulliford, et al. Injunction. Injunction dissolved and action dismissed.

F. Fisk vs. H. W. Gulliford, et al. Contempt of court. Court finds for defendant and action is dismissed. Judgment on mandate. Present sheriff ordered to make and deliver deed to E. B. and Elizabeth C. Loper. Plaintiff allowed to file corrected affidavit of publication of notice of process.

Robert McMurray vs. W. F. Renke, admr. of estate of Geo. Ralston, deceased, et al. For confirmation. Objections requiring that additional amount be paid into court sustained. Money paid. Sale confirmed and deed ordered.

Cedar Rapids Supply Co. vs. H. Gund & Co., et al. Appeal. Motion for new trial overruled. Judgment on verdict. 40 days to prepare and present bill of exceptions.

Hattie Munson vs. Carl M. Person, Suit for damages. Dismissed at plaintiff's cost.

Harry McCormac vs. Webster County, Appeal. Case dismissed.

Lorenzo Burrows vs. A. H. Vandenberg, et al. Confirmation. Sale confirmed and sheriff ordered to execute and deliver deed to Geo. W. Hastings, assignee of purchase. Motion for deficiency judgment denied.

Gerhardt Olmstead, guardian, vs. Estate of Chas. Schultz, deceased. Appeal. Court finds due plaintiff balance of \$200.00. Motion for new trial overruled. 40 days given to present bill of exceptions.

Willis F. Johnson et al. vs. Andrew Erickson. Injunction. Court finds for defendant. Injunction dissolved and action dismissed. Supersedeas bond fixed at \$100.00. 40 days given to file bill of exceptions.

American Investment Co. vs. Hugh W. Gulliford, et al. Report of receiver. On motion Bernard McNeny was made party defendant, being real party interested. Receiver allowed balance in hand as compensation. Receiver discharged. 40 days to prepare bill of exceptions. Supersedeas bond fixed at \$100.00.

Albert O. Burilick vs. Louisa A. Hawley, et al. Appeal. Continued for term.

Angie Harris vs. Peoples Bank of Red Cloud. Appeal. Complete record waived in open court.

Farmers & Mechanics Banking Co. vs. J. S. Largent, et al. Suit on note. Trial to jury. Jury found in favor of plaintiff against all defendants in sum of \$1173.00; also in favor of J. S. Largent against defendant, Lincoln Importing Horse Co., for \$1879.00. Judgment of Largent against Lincoln Importing Horse Co. is subordinate to plaintiff's judgment against Lincoln Importing Horse Co. and is conditional upon defendant Largent paying plaintiff's judgment in full.

Emeline B. Knight vs. City of Red Cloud. For damages. Trial to jury. Jury finds in favor of plaintiff in sum of \$35.00. Judgment on verdict. Complete record waived in open court by parties to suit.

Arthur R. Davis vs. Adolph Jessen. Appeal. Settled and dismissed.

Elmer U. Overman vs. John W. Runchey, et al. Foreclosure. Court finds due plaintiff from defendants, J. W. and Elizabeth Runchey, on March 4, 1902, \$810.00, principal and interest. Stay of 12 months granted.

Andrew Beck et al. vs. Fritz Peters and Geo. M. Caster. Injunction. Court finds for defendants. Injunction dissolved and action dismissed. Supersedeas bond fixed at \$100.00. 40 days to present bill of exceptions.

J. T. Robinson vs. H. W. Gulliford, et al. Foreclosure. Motion to make petition more specific sustained. Defendant given 10 days to answer.

Gustav Stephan vs. Wenzel Levar. Foreclosure or tax lien. Direct heirs submitted as defendants in place of defendant, deceased, as real parties in interest. Case continued.

A. C. Sanford, guardian of minor children of A. C. Sanford, deceased, vs. Board of County Commissioners of Webster county, et al. Injunction. Motion to vacate temporary injunction sustained. Supersedeas bond fixed at \$100.00.

Red Cloud, Neb., Jan. 13, 1902.

Board of County Commissioners met in regular session. Members present, Wm. A. May, J. G. Overman, Clarence Wilson, Fred Garlock and Wellington Richard.

Board called to order by E. S. Garber, county clerk, and on motion, Wm. A. May was elected chairman of county board. Adolph Hartman was appointed road overseer of road district No. 28.

By petition, Yancey Sorenson was appointed road overseer of road district No. 16. Joseph Taylor was appointed road overseer of road district No. 52.

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners of Webster County:

GENTLEMEN:—I would respectfully ask for an allowance not to exceed the limit of the law for a deputy, and said allowance to come out of the fees collected in office of county treasurer.
