Two rural mail routes will be established at Franklin on April 1st.

An alleged rapist was captured south of Cambridge. He is charged with having assaulted a lady at Bloomington.

The Y. M. C. A. in Nebraska has a membership of 3,600.

York is a city of 6,000 or 7,000 inhabitants, has several schools and no saloon.

John T. Mason, living between Guide Rock and North Branch, sustained a total loss of his barn and its contents by fire on Sunday, March 2.
