Annual Appropriation Bill.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Red Cloud:

Section 1. That there be, and there hereby is, appropriated from the amount of tax authorized to be levied and levied for the fiscal year of 1902, to defray all necessary expenses and liabilities of said city, the following sums for the following named purposes, to-wit:

For general and incidental expenses, \$3140 00
Including:
For streets, alleys and sidewalks \$ 500
For officers' salaries 1750
For maintenance and care of city water works 300
For costs and expense of litigation 200
For supplies and printing 200
For contingent and incidental expenses 240
For health protection against contagious disease 150

For interest on water bonds 1500 00
For interest on electric light bonds 360 00
To reimburse city for expense of building sidewalks 42 40

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication according to law.

An Ordinance

providing for the levying of a special tax on certain property in the city of Red Cloud, Nebraska, for the purpose of covering the cost of building a sidewalk bounding said property.

Be it ordained by the mayor and council of the city of Red Cloud, Nebraska: That the following taxes be, and the same are hereby levied upon all the assessable property within the city of Red Cloud, Nebraska, for the fiscal year commencing on the first Tuesday in May, 1902:

For general revenue purposes, ten (10) mills on the dollar of the assessed valuation thereof.
For interest on water bonds, fifteen (15) mills on the dollar of the assessed valuation thereof.
For interest on electric light bonds, four (4) mills on the dollar of the assessed valuation thereof.

This ordinance shall take effect from and after its approval and publication as required by law.
