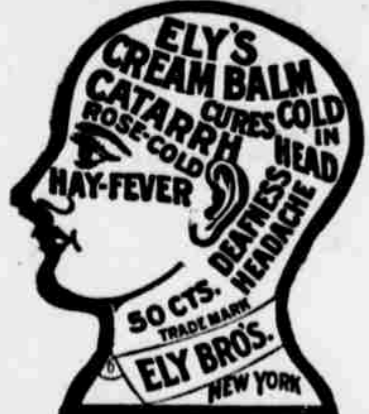

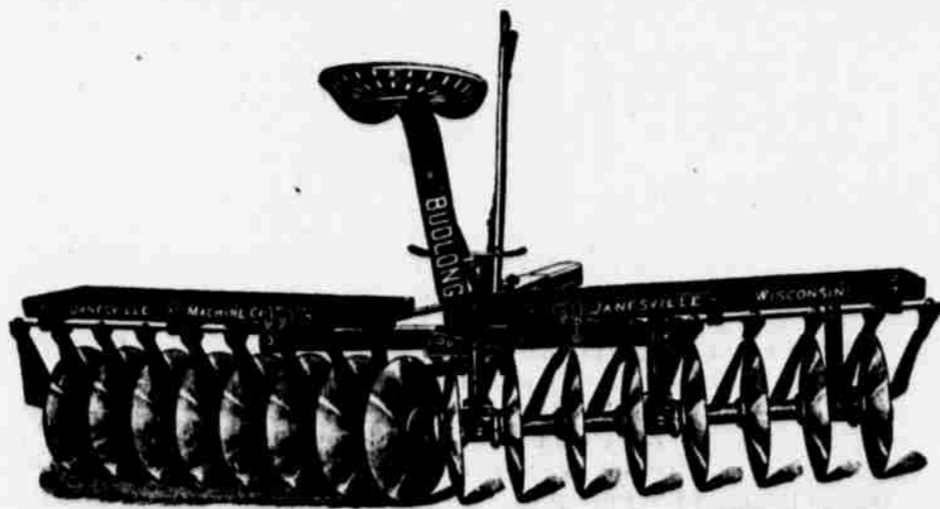
## DESCRIPTION OF THE BUGGY.
