St. Petersburg, Feb. 26, 2:45 a. m .-A telegram from Viceroy Alexieff to the czar says:

"At a quarter before 3 on the morning of February 24 numerous Japanese torpedo boats attempted to attack the battleship Retvizan and to sink large steamers loaded with inflammables. The Retvizan was the first to observe the torpedo boats and was supported by the land batteries. She destroyed two steamers near the the entrance to the harbor, which were coming directly towards her. The Retvizan observed four steamers in a sinking condition and eight torpedo boats departing slowly to join the waiting Japanese warships. A portion of the crews of the Japanese
