Lincoln Letter

this year, it may appear that it needs to be strengthened in certain parts or toned down in other places, in which case the ensuing legislature will be able to see its duty clearly a duty which no legislator dare shirk. At present the law stands untried, consequently unconvicted except in the minds of those who have been unduly alarmed by the doleful predictions of men and journals who can see nothing but evil in any policy or measure which bears the stamp of republicanism.

State Veterinarian Thomas has returned from Broken Bow where he attended a meeting of stockmen. He reports that practically all of the cattle in Custer county are, or have been, affected with parasitic diseases, and that the ranchmen had organized for the purpose of manufacturing the lime and sulphur dip recommended by the state and national veterinary departments, the intention being to erect a large plant at Broken Bow, and sell the preparation at cost to all resident stockmen. Large dipping vats with heating appliances will be installed in various parts of the country and cattle owners will have free access to them. The sheriff of Thomas county telegraphs the department that all of the herds in that vicinity will have been dipped by the last of next week.

Attorney General Prout has notified the assessment board that in his opinion fraternal insurance companies cannot claim exemption for their reserve funds. The Attorney General's position is that while fraternal organizations are charitable in their nature, their insurance policies are plain contracts, and that the rights of their members depend upon the payment of their dues or assessments. One state fraternal association has \$300,000 on hand which will be taxed if the board accepts General Prout's idea as the correct one.

The assessor of Lancaster county has fixed a valuation of \$225,000 upon the property of the Lincoln Traction company, the valuation last year being \$125,000 or slightly more than half that of this year. In fixing the valuation the assessor went behind the statements made by the company and based his estimate upon a bona fide bid upon the property made by an eastern syndicate a few months ago.
