**Kansas City Market.**  
**Special to THE CHIEF.**  
 Kansas City, Mo., Oct. 11.—The outlook today is for the biggest week's business of the season in the cattle yards. Cattle supply for two days is more than 45,000 head, which have been handled with a loss of 10 or 15 cents on beef steers, cows were strong yesterday, but are lower today, st. ckers and feeders steady to 15 cents lower. This just about places the market on the same basis as before the gain made last week. There has not been anything strictly dry lot offered either yesterday or today, and \$5.50 was the best price yesterday, and \$5.55 is the best today. Strictly choice beef steers would bring around \$9. Most of the grass steers that packers have bought were secured at \$3.25 to \$4.50. Dry lot she stuff is scarce, but good heavy grass cows sell at \$2.60 to \$3, heifers on up to \$3.75. The demand from packers for seasons just now, and prices are the highest, at \$1.75 to \$2.25. Good to choice dehorned native feeders bring \$3.75 to \$4.25, plain horned steers and branded western \$3 to \$3.95, and off color and rough stuff can be secured below \$3. Stock cattle sell some below \$2 to 2.75, somewhat higher than a week or two ago. Cattle runs this week and next are expected to be at a maximum, but after that moderate receipts will result in stronger prices.  
 The hog market for the past week has been very unsatisfactory for several reasons. The price has steadily declined, slowly on good heavy weights but rapidly on medium and light weights, especially as the latter class

have included a great many grassy animals, very undesirable from a packing standpoint. Market is 5 to 10 cents lower today, with the best heavy hogs selling at \$5.50 to \$5.70, medium weights at \$5.30 to \$5.45, and lights and pigs on down to \$5.25.  
 The packer buyers are taking good care of the sheep receipts, as markets have been steady to strong for several weeks past, although the runs have been large. That part of the stuff that is not suitable for the packers is readily taken by country buyers at steady prices.

**Proposed Constitutional Amendment.**  
 The following proposed amendment to and revision of the constitution of the constitution of the State of Nebraska, as hereinafter set forth, is submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska to be voted upon at the general election to be held Tuesday, November 8, A. D. 1914.  
 (SENATE FILE NO. 114.)  
 A Bill for a Joint Resolution recommending to the electors of the State of Nebraska, at the next election of members of the Legislature for or against a convention to revise and change the constitution of the State of Nebraska in accordance with section 2, Article 15, of the constitution of the State of Nebraska.  
 It is Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Nebraska:  
 1. That it is deemed necessary to call a convention to revise, amend and change the constitution of the State of Nebraska.  
 2. That the electors are recommended to vote at the next election of members of the Legislature for or against a convention to revise, amend and change the constitution of the State of Nebraska.  
 3. That at such next election of members of the Legislature on the ballot of each elector voting at such election, shall be printed or written in such manner that the elector can indicate his preference under the law the words: "FOR calling a convention to revise, amend and change the constitution of the State of Nebraska," and "AGAINST calling a convention to revise, amend and change the constitution of the State of Nebraska;" and if a majority voting in said election shall vote for a convention, the Legislature shall, at its next session, provide by law for calling the same.  
 I, Geo. W. Marsh, Secretary of State of the State of Nebraska, do hereby certify that the foregoing proposed amendment to the constitution of the State of Nebraska, as true and correct copy of the original enrolled bill passed by the twenty eighth session of the Legislature of the State of Nebraska, as it appears from an original bill on file in my office, and that said proposed amendment and revision of the constitution of the State of Nebraska, is submitted to the qualified voters of the State of Nebraska, for their adoption or rejection, at the general election to be held on Tuesday, the 8th day of November, A. D. 1914.  
 In testimony whereof, I hereunto set my hand and affixed the Great Seal of the State of Nebraska.  
 Done at Lincoln this 5th day of July in the year of our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Four, of the Independence of the United States the One Hundred and Twenty Ninth and of this State the Thirty Eighth.
