A Comparison.

In looking over the records of the county court for the past four years one can find some interesting figures. A comparison of the business done during the last two years of Judge Edson's administration and Judge Keeney's term shows a decided increase during the last two years.
During Judge Edson's last term (1902-3) 51 estate cases were filed for probate; during Judge Keeney's term there were 73, an increase of 22.
Judge Edson disposed of 58 civil cases, while Judge Keeney had 87, an increase of 29.
During his two years of service Mr. Keeney heard more than twice as many criminal cases as his predecessor—46 against 20.
In the matter of marriages and marriage licenses Judge Keeney's term also shows a big increase, he having issued 235 licenses and united 85 couples, Judge Edson's record being 191 licenses issued and 63 couples married during his last term.
