

ALLEGED SWINDLERS ARRESTED

Fraudulent Underwriting Concerns Raided at Chicago.

Chicago, Nov. 21 .- Several underwriting companies, which are alleged to be the largest fraudulent concerns of the kind ever operated in Chicago. were raided by United States marshals, assisted by postal inspectors. and seven men, accused of promoting the fraudulent enterprises, were ar- duty rested. According to the federal authorities, the men accused of operating the swindles had many victims and obtained nearly a million dollars by the scheme. The names of the men arrested and the companies with which the federal authorities say they are connected follow:

W. J. Root, president; W. H. Welch, vice president, and W. D. Hulburt, secretary of the Central States Underwriting and Guarantee company. Charles Endicott Brown, president of the Prudential Securities Corporations Brokers. Frank S. Winslow, president of the American Corporation and Security company. Ezra C. Barnum, president of the National Stock and Guaranty company and the Bankers' Credit and Mercantile company. David C. Owings, National Stock and Guaranty company.

Hulburt, Root and Welch were taken to the United States district court and gave bonds of \$5,000 each for their appearance for trial. The other men who were arrested were locked up in jail because they were unable to obtain bonds.

The alleged fraudulent operation of the men, as explained by the postal authorities, is that the underwriting companies were in league with certain of the brokers, with whom they divided the fee taken for the supposed underwriting, which was never done by the alleged underwriters.

SEVEN KILLED IN LANDSLIDE

Italian Trackmen Swept Down Moun-

tain Side and Into River. Bluefield, W. Va., Nov. 21.-Seven trackmen of a gang of nineteen, engaged in removing a slide on the Dry Fork branch of the Norfolk and Western railroad, were killed as the result of a big slip of land. The men were swept down the mountain side and into the river. Twelve escaped. The bodies of four of the victims were recovered and three of the bodies are buried under hundreds of tons of earth. All of the victims were Italian laborers and were known only by numbers, not names.

HOTEL WRECKED IN CANADA.

Man and Woman Killed and Ten injured in Explosion of Eynamite.


Grand Forks, B. C., Nov. 21 .- At Niagara, a railway village seven miles up the North fork of the Kittle river. unidentified persons wrecked the Canadian hotel with dynamite.

The explosion killed Louise King. aged eighteen, and a strange Italian. and injured nine other persons. Three boxes of dynamite were used. The explosive was solen from the storehouse of a contractor named Tierney.
