GAME LAWS.

Some Slight Changes in the Old Laws Concerning Open Season.

Following is a condensed outline of the Nebraska game laws as amended by the present legislature.

OPEN SEASON.

Prairie chicken and grouse, September 15 to November 30.

Quail, November 15 to 30.

Ducks, geese, jack-snipes, etc., September 15 to April 10.

Trout, April 1 to September 30.

All other fish, April 1 to November 15.

WHAT IS ALWAYS UNLAWFUL.

To kill squirrels at any season.

To kill song or insectivorous birds.

To shoot upon the public highway.

To hunt upon the lands of another without permission.

To hunt without license except in the county of actual residence.

To ship game or fish from one point to another within or without the state unaccompanied by the owner.

To pursue game in any manner during closed season.

To fish in any manner except with hook and line.

To sell game in any manner or to sell fish taken from public waters in the state.
