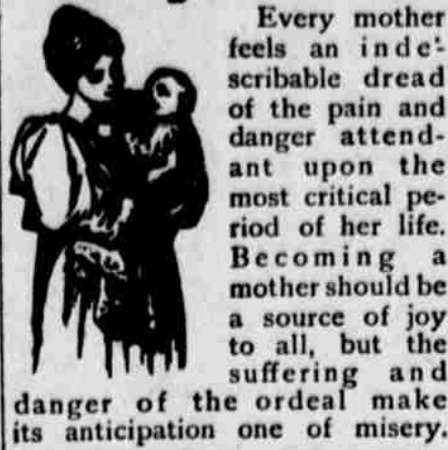

REPORT OF THE CONDITION OF THE PEOPLE'S BANK OF RED CLOUD CHARTER NO. 346, at Red Cloud, in the State of Nebraska, at the close of business July 14, 1898.

Ordinance No. 69. An Ordinance to amend Section 24 of an ordinance known as Number 74 of the compiled ordinances of the City of Red Cloud. Be it ordained by the mayor and city council of the City of Red Cloud, Nebraska, that Section 24 of an ordinance known and described as Number 74 of the compiled ordinances of the City of Red Cloud, Nebraska, be amended to read as follows:

Ordinance No. 68. An ordinance appropriating moneys out of the several funds of the City of Red Cloud, Nebraska, to the use of the city. Be it ordained by the mayor and council of Red Cloud, Nebraska, that the following amounts be and the same are hereby appropriated out of the several funds herein designated for the specific purposes herein mentioned for the fiscal year 1898, to wit: Out of the general fund, for official salaries \$250, for street and water commissioner and police \$180, for hall rent \$100, for incidental expenses \$250; out of water bond fund, for interest on water bond \$1500.00; out of water levy fund, for water engineer \$400.00; out of occupation fund, for repairs on streets \$500.00; for incidental expenses \$200.00; out of water fund, for coal \$400.00; for repairs to water system \$800.00. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on and after its publication according to law.

Ordinance No. 67. An ordinance for the levy of taxes upon all the taxable property of the City of Red Cloud, Nebraska, for the fiscal year commencing on the first Tuesday in May, 1898. Be it ordained by the mayor and council of the City of Red Cloud, Nebraska, that the following taxes be, and the same are hereby levied upon all the taxable property of the City of Red Cloud, Nebraska, as per the assessed valuation thereof for the fiscal year commencing on the first Tuesday in May, 1898, to wit: For general revenue purposes 10 mills on the dollar, for the payment of interest on water bonds 13 mills on the dollar, for the payment of interest on electric light bonds 5 mills on the dollar, for maintenance of water works 5 mills on the dollar. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its publication as provided by law.

Ordinance No. 66. An Ordinance to amend Section 24 of an ordinance known as Number 74 of the compiled ordinances of the City of Red Cloud. Be it ordained by the mayor and city council of the City of Red Cloud, Nebraska, that Section 24 of the compiled ordinances of the City of Red Cloud, Nebraska, be amended to read as follows: Section 24.—It shall be unlawful for any person within said city to sprinkle, eject or throw water from private public sprinkler, washer or hydrant upon any public street, lane or alley, or any yard, garden or enclosure, or permit or cause the same to be done, nor upon or against any building upon such street, lane or alley, except for the extinguishment of fire and ordinary house cleaning except between the hours of 8 and 7 o'clock a.m. and 6 and 5 o'clock p.m. of each day. It shall also be unlawful for any person having a sprinkler, washer or hydrant in or in front of his premises to sprinkle, eject or throw water in front of the premises of any other person, or permit or cause the same to be done except for the extinguishment of fire, and any other person violating any of the provisions of this section shall upon conviction thereof be fined in any sum, not exceeding Ten Dollars and stand committed until such fine and costs are paid. That said original section be and the same is hereby repealed. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its publication according to law.
