GUNS ARE NOW CHEAP

Changes in Sporting Weapons by Smokeless Powder.

Different Materials and Mechanism Now in Use—Cut Prices and Second-Hand Pieces Figure in the Reduction.

With every prospect of a fine fowling and hunting season the sportsmen are looking around for the latest things in guns. It looks as if perfection had been nearly reached so far as structural features are concerned, and the great problem in which are the best of certain fairly new devices grafted on old standards.

The magazine fowling piece proper is receiving more attention than for years past. Especially has this been the case with the reed bird and the rail hunters this fall.

Possibly never before were guns so cheap as at present. It is said that the cut price fever is responsible for this, and that the second-hand guns so extensively advertised are second hand in the same way as the bicycles were when a ride around Central park had roughened the tires a little and so enabled the dealer to sell them at "second-hand" prices without breaking his price agreement.

The smokeless powders have also been extensively used in rifles, especially those of small caliber. The experience in actual game shooting with these arms has been about the same as in war.

COUNTED BY MACHINERY. Facts About Each Person Will Be Tabulated for the Census by Electricity.

Our first census, made in 1795, showed the population of the United States to be 3,000,000, and the count cost Uncle Sam, who was comparatively poor then, one cent for each person. It is estimated that the twelfth census, to be made in June, 1900, will show that our people number 75,000,000, and that the item of clerk hire, in the census bureau alone, will exceed \$5,000,000.

SCIENCE AND INDUSTRY.

The chalk plate process is being used with satisfaction in the various monthly reports of the Climate and Crop Service.

Liquid air is so cold that mercury immersed in it turns solid, and can be employed to hammer a nail. Yet, when a glass tube containing liquid hydrogen is immersed in liquid air the hydrogen gently boils, and gradually turns into vapor, like water simmering over a slow fire.

The St. Lawrence canals will attract a great deal of trade when they are completed. The capacity of the canals now nearing completion will at first be about 3,000,000 tons a year in one direction, but by degrees as ships are built more to the requirements of the trade, the capacity may be doubled, and when the power of the falls for lighting purposes is fully used and the canal system comes under the government's control 12,000,000 tons each way may be handled.

A shaft which has just been completed by the Bethlehem Steel company for the Boston Elevated railway is 27 feet 10 inches long, and the diameter of the flywheel fit is 37 inches; the diameter of journals, 34 inches; the diameter of the crank disk fit 32 inches.

STARTLING RAT STORY. A London District Post Office Closed and Houses Overrun by the Rodents.

About a year ago an important district post office in London was closed. It had been opened for stamps, money orders, post office orders and telegrams till midnight, and it was in the center of a thickly-populated district.

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EFFECTS OF WAR ON GAMES. I heard two South African sportsmen discussing the other day the possible effects a campaign spread over a large area might have on the dwindling big game of that region.

The conclusion they arrived at was that the game had already receded beyond the possible sphere of influence of such operations. At the same time war has before now had strange and far-reaching effects on the distribution of local fauna, as, for instance, when the cannonading in 1870-71 drove great bustards across the seas and into our eastern countries in numbers unprecedented since that magnificent bird forsook this island for good and all many years ago.—London Leader.

Her Majesty's Portrait. Prof. Angell, the queen's favorite painter, who has recently been intrusted with the execution of a portrait of her majesty, enjoys her highest confidence. No secret, he has been telling an interviewer, is hidden from him. The last time the queen was sitting to him at Windsor castle, on the occasion of her eightieth birthday, she wished to be taken simply as a woman, not as the queen. This portrait, at her majesty's desire, is to be reproduced for circulation among the English people. The queen, however, will not allow the original portrait to be used for reproduction, so Prof. Angell will make a copy of it.—Chicago Times-Herald.

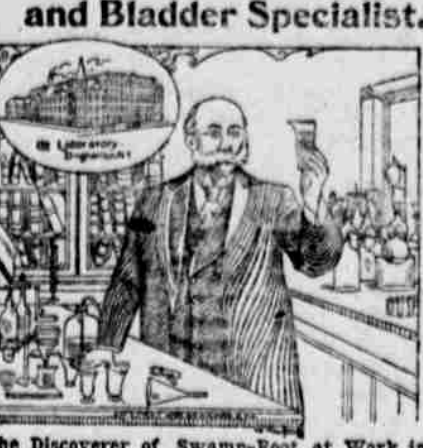
