PLENTY OF APPLES.

This Year's Crop Nearly Twice as Large as That of 1898.

Distribution of the Crop Between the Short States—How the Fruit is Handled in Chicago.

The apple crop this year is twice as large as that of 1898, according to South Water street apple kings. Even then it is but 60 per cent. of a full crop and is not to be compared with the immense crop of 1896, when apples sold as low as 75 cents a barrel and were so cheap that no money could be made on them by either grower or handler. The quality this year is also superior to that of 1895, with prices in general lower. New York apples are higher than a year ago, but that is due to the exceptionally fine quality of this season's New York fruit.

The distribution of the crop varies, as it does every year. New York has about 40 per cent. of a crop, Michigan 50 per cent. of a crop, mostly of No. 2 apples. The New England crop is light. Last year the west had none. This season Indiana has a larger yield than for ten years past and the piles of apples on the cellar floor are bigger than for a long time. Ohio and Iowa did fairly well. Illinois has a fair crop of mediums. Missouri's yield is small and of poor quality. Wisconsin and Minnesota are buyers. California did well, as did Canada, which has about 60 per cent. of a crop.

The Pacific coast is coming up in apple production. It is not much of a factor this year, however, on account of the quantity of fruit raised in the middle west and east. In a few years it will be of greater importance, although even now it is of importance in case of a shortage over the rest of the country.

This year the middle west and east are exchanging fruit in a kind of apple reciprocity. New York is swapping her famous greenings, Baldwins, russets, Grimes' golden and spys for western Jonathans, wine snaps and Ben Davis, especially the latter.

The apple picking season is now over and the heads of apples are coming into Chicago for cold storage. Only the best hand-picked apples will stand cold storage for any length of time. Chicago handles about 50 per cent. of the crop in the country, and at least 20 per cent. of its apples. It would handle a larger percentage of the latter were it not for the number of cold storage plants constructed throughout the fruit districts in New York state.

The common practice of large South Water street apple men buying apples varies in different sections. In New York most of the apples purchased by them are bought by the barrel, being picked by the grower but packed in the orchard by the commission firms' own packers. A few firms have as many as 500 men in their employ during the four to six weeks' packing season. But New York fruit farmers are old hands at the business, and many of them pack their own fruit, either selling it to apple firms' representatives or consigning it themselves to commission houses. In Illinois more apples are bought on the trees. Occasionally speculative investors buy the prospective crops of orchards in bloom.

In Chicago three or four South Water street houses handle the fruit in car lots, as well as in lesser quantity, and to them the minor commission men go for part of their stock. Firms sandwiched between these two extremes in the volume of their business buy outright over the country and receive commission on a lesser scale than the leaders.—Chicago Times-Herald.

THE LATEST KLONDIKE.

Some Interesting Particulars About Cape Nome in Far Away Alaska.

Cape Nome, on the northern Alaska coast, is now the place which figures largest in the hopes and dreams of gold seekers and fortune hunters throughout the world. Discoveries quite unprecedented in the history of gold mining have been made on the sea beach and the adjacent region at this point.

The existence of gold at Cape Nome was made known only a few months ago, but the rush in this direction has been very great recently, and the region is now a hive of industry. The settlement here called Anvil City is only a few months old, and now has a population of over 8,000. All kinds of business are booming, and corner lots, lumber, fuel, mining equipment and provisions are up to sky prices.

Old miners declare Cape Nome to be the most wonderful placer camp ever discovered. Fabulous stories are told of the riches found in the sand of the beach and in the gulches and creeks thereabout. One miner named Lindbloom, who returned to Seattle a few days ago, cleared up \$100,000 during the present season, and has refused \$50,000 in cash for his holdings. A single nugget worth \$450 was taken from one of his claims recently. Another man from Sioux City, Ia., has brought down to Seattle with him \$5,000 in dust taken from a space 45 feet square on Cape Nome beach. The storekeepers at Anvil City are said to have refused to accept any more dust, as their vaults and safes are full.—Leslie's Weekly.

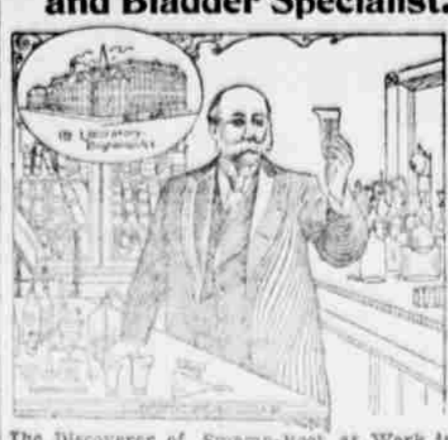
