State of Nebraska vs. Oscar Wohler; grand larceny. Plead not guilty. Trial to jury. Jury returned verdict of not guilty and prisoner discharged.

Chas. Lepin vs. Geo. E. Coon, sheriff; mandate. Judgment for plaintiff as per stipulations on file.

Preston B. Sibley, Exec. of Mary E. Eusworth, deceased, vs. John Zackery et al; confirmation. Order to show cause by Wednesday morning why sale should not be confirmed.
