SEFATE. The Senate met at noon, Mr. Carpenter presiding.

Mr. Edmunds, from the Judiciary Committee, reported back the House bill to repeal the bankrupt law, with amendments.

On motion of Mr. Wright, the House salary bill was taken up with amendments reported by the Senate committee on civil service and retrenchment.

Mr. Allison introduced a bill to regulate and facilitate commerce across navigable rivers forming the boundary of States.

The House met at noon. More than a quorum was present, and the galleries were crowded with spectators.

Under call of States a large number of bills were referred, including a bill by Mr. Hoar, of Massachusetts, for a labor commission.

Robert K. Johnson, Jr., partner in the supply house of Crocker, Wood & Co., 32 South street, this city, committed suicide at his residence in Brooklyn yesterday.
