(Special Correspondence of the Bee.) KEARNEY JUNCTION, Neb., May 26, 1874.

Kearney is located at the junction of the B. & M. and Union Pacific railroads, one and one-half miles from the Platte and 190 miles from Omaha via B. & M. R. R.

About the middle of 1872, Kearney Junction consisted of one small store, which was opened for the purpose of supplying the few farmers and immigrants.

Since then settlers have located so rapidly that now there are 200 buildings and a population of 700 souls.

The soil is the black loam, for which the Platte Valley is justly celebrated, is well adapted to the cultivation of the various grains.

A luxuriant growth, in the natural state of the most nutritious wild grasses, covers the prairie.

In two or three years, at most, the county seat will undoubtedly be moved here, as Kearney is the geographical centre of the county.
