The city council has been doing

some good work on Fifth Avenue this week. This street has been graded up and it presents a much better appearance. One by one our streets are being built up in a permanent manner and soon the entire city will be in excellent condition. This will decrease the cost of street work and in a short time this appropriation will not amount to much.

The Farmer's telephone building is being rapidly built. The brick work is all completed and the building will soon be ready for occupancy. When completed this will be one of the best buildings of its kind in the state. There will be large commodious rooms and offices well lighted and well arranged for transacting a business of this kind. The entire cost of the building will be paid for from the net earnings and no assessment on the stockholders will be made. This is an excellent showing for the management of this concern and the Farmers are to be congratulated on what they have accomplished.

Work on the court house is progressing rapidly. The concrete foundations are nearly all in, the steel for the floors and joists are on the ground. As far as we can learn the work so far completed is first class in every respect. The contractor shows every evidence of knowing his business completely and the county is assured of a good building. This will be a fire proof building in every sense of the term. The floors are to be reinforced concrete and all the partitions are to be tile so there will be no danger of fire at any time.

**Crop Prospects Look Very Good**

Never before in the history of this country have the crops been so promising as this year. We have had an abundance of rain, the pastures are the best ever, the first crop of alfalfa is a bumper, wheat is rated at a 100 percent plus, the corn is making a rapid growth. Without another drop of rain the wheat will mature and the yield will be large. While every field of wheat this year is exceptionally good, one can see here and there a field that is far better than the average. This is because the soil was properly prepared, the seed properly put in and these fields show the effects of better care. They will yield more and thus pay for the extra attention but the difference would be more marked if the season had been unfavorable. The potatoes are growing large and thrifty and there will be an early harvest. The gardens are supplying the tables extravagantly and we are living in the garden spot of the earth.
