 Farmers cutting corn for the last time are advised by the Nebraska College of Agriculture not to cultivate too deeply. At the last cultivation, the roots have spread out to such a distance and are so near the surface that the shovel points may do them considerable damage. The long, deep running points of the four-shovel cultivators are particularly apt to be harmful in this way. In "taying-by" corn, one is justified in cultivating deeply only when weeds are large or the ground has been badly run through by last season's heavy, packing rains.
