Townpeople who frequent the Chamber of Commerce rooms should join that organization and secure all the benefits. Persons outside of the city are invited to use the rooms whenever they desire.

Something ought to be done to make the town hitching racks more serviceable. Whenever it rains the water stands around the posts, the horses stamp to shake off the flies and the buggy and harness are bespattered with mud. These places should be properly drained or else filled with cinders.

Those who intend to bring produce and other articles to the Farmers' Institute which will be held a little later on should select their goods now. A much better exhibit can be made if everything is not left to the last minute. Indications are that this year's institute will far surpass any previous effort. That is saying a good deal, since Red Cloud is known the state over for holding institutes that are right up to the top notch.

Who among us that cannot sing with new meaning today, "My country, 'tis of thee, sweet land of liberty," and find a deeper and sweeter exultation in contending our own land of peace and prosperity with war-distressed Europe? The editor of the Progress evidently does not know that in Webster county this year the county superintendent's office is practically a non-partisan affair. Miss Gertrude Coon is running for re-election without opposition. Being the only candidate in the field, she is rightly considered the candidate of all the parties. Could any testimony as to her efficiency be higher? Every state in the Union was represented at the annual convention of the United Post Office Clerks Association,

which was held in Omaha last week. Four hundred and fifty-seven accredited delegates were seated by the credentials-committee. The feature of the entertainment was a moving picture exhibition given by the Bureau of Publicity, when moving pictures of Omaha and Nebraska were shown. The resources of the state and metropolis were explained exhaustively and the big crowd of visitors left with a different opinion of Omaha and the state. A movement by the insurgents in the convention to overthrow the administration was defeated by eighty-seven votes, all the old officers being re-elected. Los Angeles was selected as the next meeting place.

At the general election in Nebraska this fall her citizens will by their votes either approve, or condemn the administration of Woodrow Wilson as president of the United States. By placing the state in the democratic column you can approve his acts, and at the same time elect men who will aid him in the construction of still greater things. Especially is this true in the election of congressmen who have a direct working power in accordance with the wishes of the president and his party. Regardless of your former political affiliations, Mr. Voter, if you are satisfied with the manner in which Woodrow Wilson is conducting the affairs of this nation, go to the polls in November and vote the Democratic ticket from top to bottom, and thus assist in maintaining a satisfactory administration.—Alma Journal.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. THREE. The following proposed amendment to the constitution of the State of Nebraska, as heretofore set forth in full, is submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska, to be voted upon at the general election to be held Tuesday, November 3rd, A. D. 1914.

Section 1. That the general election for state and legislative officers, to be held on the first Monday in November, 1914, and each succeeding year shall be held at the same relative time in each year thereafter. The Governor, Secretary of State, Auditor of Public Accounts, and Treasurer shall reside at the seat of government during their terms of office, and keep the public records, books and papers thereof, and shall perform such duties as may be required by law.

Section 2. That at said election on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday in November, 1914, on the ballot of such elector voting hereon, there shall be printed or written the words: "For proposed amendments to the constitution, fixing the term of office and salary for governor, and other executive officers," and "Against proposed amendments to the constitution, fixing the term of office and salary for governor, and other executive officers."

Approved, April 21, 1914. L. Addison Wait, Secretary of State, of the State of Nebraska, do hereby certify that the foregoing proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Nebraska is a true and correct copy of the original enrolled and engrossed bill, as passed by the Thirty-third session of the Legislature of the State of Nebraska, as appears from said original bill on file in this office, and that said proposed amendment is submitted to the qualified voters of the State of Nebraska for their adoption or rejection at the general election to be held on Tuesday, the 3rd day of November, A. D. 1914. In Testimony Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed the Great Seal of the State of Nebraska, Done at Lincoln, this 23rd day of March, in the year of our Lord, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fourteen, and of the Independence of the United States the One Hundred and Thirty-seventh, and of this State the Forty-seventh.
