Two cows were in the Nebraska University Farm herd a short time ago which looked very much alike. Most people, perhaps, would have judged one to be a little better than the other. The average feed of one for two years cost \$64.15. The average feed for the other was 35 cents a year more. The one that it cost \$64.15 to feed produced about \$10 a year more than she cost. The one that it cost 35 cents a year more to feed returned five times the income of the other above cost of feed.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. THREE

The following proposed amendment to the constitution of the State of Nebraska, as hereinafter set forth in full, is submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska, to be voted upon at the general election to be held Tuesday, November 3rd, A. D. 1914.

Section 1. That at the general election for state and legislative officers, to be held on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday in November, 1914, the following be submitted as amendments to Sections 1 and 24, of Article V, of the Constitution of Nebraska:

Section 1. The executive department shall consist of a Governor, who shall hold his office for a term of two years from the first Thursday after the first Tuesday in January, next after his election, and until his successor is elected and qualified. In addition to the Governor, the executive department shall include the following officers: Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Auditor of Public Accounts, Treasurer, Superintendent of Public Instruction, Attorney General, and Commissioner of Public Lands and Buildings, each of whom shall hold his office for the term of two years from the first Thursday after the first Tuesday in January, next after his election, and until his successor is elected and qualified. Provided, however, that the first election of said officers shall be held on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday in November, 1914, and each succeeding election shall be held at the same relative time in each even year thereafter.

Section 24. The salary of the Governor shall be five thousand (\$5,000.00) dollars per annum. The salaries of Auditor of Public Accounts and Secretary of State, Superintendent of Public Instruction and Commissioner of Public Lands and Buildings shall be two thousand five hundred (\$2,500.00) dollars each per annum, and of the Attorney General, four thousand dollars (\$4,000.00) per annum, the salary of the State Treasurer shall be three thousand (\$3,000.00) dollars per annum, and the Lieutenant Governor shall receive one and one-half the compensation of a senator, and after the adoption of this constitution they shall not receive to their own use any fees, costs, interests upon public moneys in their hands, or under their control, prerequisites of office or other compensation, and all fees that may hereafter be payable by law for services performed by an officer provided for in this article of the constitution shall be paid in advance into the state treasury. There shall be no allowance for clerk hire in the offices of the Superintendent of Public Instruction and Attorney General.

Section 2. That at said election on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday in November, 1914, on the ballot of each elector voting thereat, there shall be printed or written the words: "For proposed amendments to the constitution, fixing the term of office and salary for governor, and other executive officers," and "Against proposed amendments to the constitution, fixing the term of office and salary for governor, and other executive officers."

Approved, April 21, 1917. Addison Wait, Secretary of State, of the State of Nebraska, do hereby certify that the foregoing proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, and correct copy of the original enrolled and engrossed bill, as passed by the Thirty-third session of the Legislature of the State of Nebraska, as appears from said original bill on file in this office, and that said proposed amendment is submitted to the qualified voters of the State of Nebraska for their adoption or rejection at the general election to be held on Tuesday, the 3rd day of November, A. D. 1914.

In Testimony Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed the Great Seal of the State of Nebraska, this 23rd day of March, in the year of our Lord, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fourteen, and of the Independence of the United States, the One Hundred and Thirty-seventh, and of this State the Forty-seventh.
