**Cholera Germs
In Water Supply?**

Have you reasonable assurance that
your hogs are not drinking water laden
with cholera germs? Are they drink-
ing water from a creek or slough? It
may be that the picturesque stream
flowing thru the hog pasture contains
germs from the carcasses of hogs
which died from cholera many miles
away. Sunshine and fresh air do
much to purify the stream as it passes
from one farm to another, but many
cases of cholera have been traced to
the seepage from cholera infected
spots far beyond the knowledge of the
man down stream.
The department of animal pathology
at the University Farm not only urges
great care in the supply of water for
hogs but advises that liability from
cholera from this one source may be
avoided if the hogs are fenced off from
streams flowing thru the farm.
