Mr. J. F. Grimes Dies Very Suddenly

Frank Grimes, one of the oldest and most highly respected citizens of Blue Hill, died suddenly of heart failure at his home last night. While Mr. Grimes had been complaining some for a few days past, still he was able to be about home and to make occasional trips up town. Last night about midnight he got up out of bed to go down in the basement to regulate the furnace fire and draft. After coming up from the basement and entering the bed room he complained to his wife of feeling sick. He had barely lain down when a deathly pallor spread over his face, there were a few gasps and death quickly followed. In the meantime the family physician had been hastily summoned but death came too suddenly for any medical relief.

Mr. Grimes was one of the pioneer residents of Blue Hill. He conducted the first mercantile house here for J. W. Davis of Hastings. Later he engaged in the drug business and was the pioneer dealer in this line. He was continuously engaged in the drug business up to a few years ago when he sold out and retired.—Friday's *Hastings Daily Republican*.

Mr. Grimes was born in Pennsylvania, September 28, 1848, and was 66 years and 4 months old at the time of his demise. He was married to Miss Myra Lynn in 1881 at Rockport, Illinois, and to this union were born three sons, Edward, who is connected with the H. E. Grice Drug Co. of this city, Lloyd and John, and one daughter, Miss Irma, all of whom survive him, together with two aged sisters, who reside in Illinois.

The funeral was held in Blue Hill on Monday and the remains were brought to this city the same evening, interment being made in the city cemetery. The Chief along with his many friends here, extend sympathy to the bereaved wife and children.

County Commissioners Met On Tuesday

Red Cloud, February 2, 1915

The Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment. Members present, Chaplin, Shidler, Storey and Hoffman. McCall, chairman of board, absent.

Moved and seconded that Chaplin act as chairman of board in the absence of McCall. Motion carried.

In the matter of the road petition of Frederick Farner set for hearing at this date, now coming on for hearing, notice of said hearing being posted as required by law, and the owners of the land adjoining the land owned by Frederick Farner having been served with personal notice of said hearing, as shown by the returns of the sheriff of Webster county.

The County Board after hearing the testimony of Frederick Farner and Geo. H. Overing under oath as to the practicability and necessity of establishing a road leading from the land owned by the said Frederick Farner to the public highway, and the testimony of John Monis, Godfrey Monia and Mr. Carey under oath against the tabling of said road leading from the land of the said Frederick Farner. It was moved and seconded that the chairman appoint a committee to view the land over which the road will run if established, whereupon the chairman appointed Storey, Shidler and Hoffman as said committee to report at their next meeting, which is on February 26, 1915, as to the feasibility, damages sustained and the value of the land taken for said road if established.

On motion W. J. Myers was and is appointed overseer of highways for road district No. 12½.

On petition of citizens of Red Cloud I. B. Stanser was appointed justice of the peace for the city of Red Cloud to fill vacancy and his official bond was approved.

On petition of voters of Glenwood precinct requesting the appointment of M. R. Lewis as deputy assessor for Glenwood precinct, the county assessor having appointed said M. R. Lewis deputy assessor of said precinct with the request that the board approve said appointment. On motion said appointment was approved.

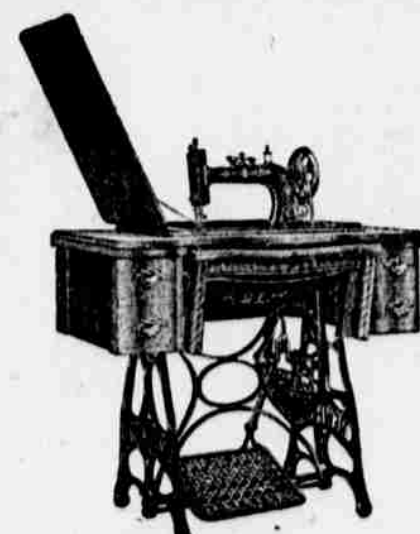
