Many Farmers Reached

The equivalent of all the men in rural Nebraska between the ages of 20 and 65 attended the »gricultural meetings of the agricultural extension service during 1914, according to figures shown in the annual report given during Organized Agricultural Week at the University Farm. The report showed that 773 farmers' institutes, short courses, special demonstration meetings, special women's clubs meetings, special junior meetings, county fair exhibitions, and miscellaneous meetings were held. The number attending all meetings was practically 223,000. In the same report it was noted that the personal correspondence of the department amounted to 20.145 typewritten pages. Over half a million circular letters of information were used, in addition. The number of extension bulletins sent on request amounted to 68,850 copies.
