The committee has reported favorably on the resolution setting apart \$1000.00 for this purpose and those in charge of the bill have every assurance that it will go thru. George W. Trine is fitting up the Lindsey building and will soon have a full line of shelf and heavy hardware on display. When the street work begins in the spring, which is not far away, we believe that one of the first things to be done is to properly grade the ground around the hitching racks of the city. The horses have stamped flies so long that they have dug holes around the racks and now when a farmer wishes to tie his team the horses must stand in water or mud. If he has a nice buggy it is soon splattered with mud. These places should be fixed at the earliest opportunity.

The members of the Red Cloud High School debating team will meet in joint debate with the high school of Guide Rock in the near future. From all reports which we receive the debaters of the high school are doing very creditable work and will give a good account of themselves in the coming debate. This work in school will be of very practical assistance to the pupils when they assume the real duties of citizenship because they will be able to express themselves when ever the opportunity presents itself. One of the most common sentiments presented by the average adult is that he cannot tell what he knows and he feels this to be a serious limitation. What we learn as children becomes second nature to us in later life and if there is anyone thing the American public needs it is the ability to express ideas. We trust that the school authorities will make this feature of school life a permanent thing.

### Raise Heavy Draft Horses

"We shall have very little use for the small driving horses from now on. The automobile has come to stay and will supersede him. The intensive farming now required, and that which we shall be compelled to do in order to derive a revenue that will remunerate the farmer on our high priced lands, will call for the heavy draft horse. It is the duty of every farmer from now on to raise colts from well bred draft stallions in order to make his business profitable to meet the great demand for heavy draft horses that is already here and that will continually increase for many years to come."—Daniel Kelly in Organized Agriculture speech at the University Farm.

### Many Farmers Reached

The equivalent of all the men in rural Nebraska between the ages of 20 and 65 attended the agricultural meetings of the agricultural extension service during 1914, according to figures shown in the annual report given during Organized Agricultural Week at the University Farm. The report showed that 773 farmers' institutes, short courses, special demonstration meetings, special women's clubs meetings, special junior meetings, county fair exhibitions, and miscellaneous meetings were held. The number attending all meetings was practically 225,000. In the same report it was noted that the personal correspondence of the department amounted to 20,145 typewritten pages. Over half a million circular letters of information were used, in addition. The number of extension bulletins sent on request amounted to 68,850 copies.
