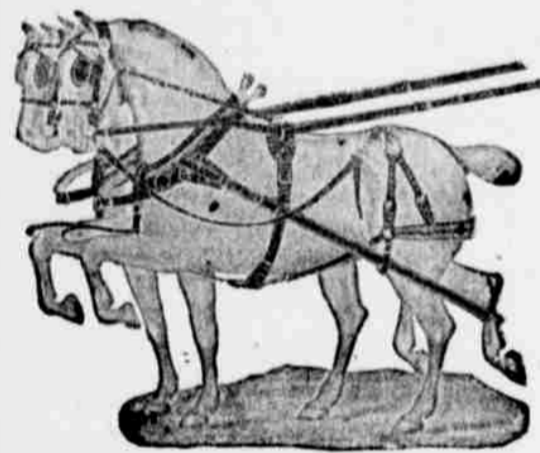

Nathan D. Illingsworth, defendant will take notice that on the 20th day of December 1914 plaintiff herein filed its petition in the County Court of Webster County, Nebraska, the object and prayer of which are to recover from defendant the sum of \$250.00 due plaintiff from defendant because of his endorsement and sale of 7 promissory notes to plaintiff, said notes having been fraudulently altered by defendant after their execution and delivery to defendant and before their negotiation to plaintiff by detaching from each of said notes so executed and delivered to said defendant a written contract which was thereto attached at the time of said execution and delivery of said notes to said defendant, and by reason whereof the legal effect of said notes was apparently changed from non-negotiable instruments to negotiable instruments, and without the knowledge or consent of the maker, or makers thereof, or any of them. That in selling said notes to plaintiff said defendant falsely and fraudulently represented that said notes were negotiable instruments. That in the sale of said notes defendant made certain false and fraudulent representations concerning same to plaintiff which representations were relied upon by plaintiff in the purchase of said notes. That said transaction occurred on or about the 18th day of July 1914. That said notes are worthless and are tendered into court for defendants use. That on the 20th day of December 1914 plaintiff filed the necessary affidavit and bond and secured the issuance of an attachment, and garnishee notice against the Webster County Bank. That on the 1st day of February said Webster County Bank, garnishee answered and disclosed that it held \$233.36 open account subject to check in favor of said defendant which amount was by the County Court ordered paid into court to abide the order of the court in said proceeding.

You will take notice that said case is set for hearing in the County Court of Webster County, Nebraska, on the 5th day of April 1915 at ten o'clock in the forenoon and unless you make answer and show cause said amount of \$233.36 will be applied in satisfaction of plaintiffs claim and such other and further action taken in said proceeding as provided by law.

There are few periods during the year when the road drag may not be used to advantage, but it generally does the most good in the spring when the soil is moist, yet not too sticky. A little public spirit shown at this time of the year may not only save the roads from becoming impassable now, but improve them the coming summer. Nebraska soils, when mixed with water, thoroughly worked, and well baked with sunshine, become extremely hard and impervious to water. This action not only helps to shed the water but also greatly hinders the formation of dust.
