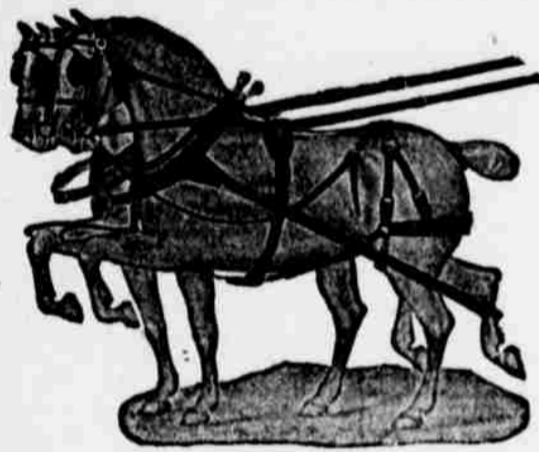

**Denver Couple Arrested  
At Peterson Farm**

On Sunday afternoon at the Wilbur Peterson ranch, seven and a half miles from Danville, Vall Turley and his wife, Lillian, who formerly resided at 1119 Speer Boulevard, Denver, were taken into custody by Sheriff W. R. Lathrop, of Smith Center, Kansas, and taken to Smith Center to await the arrival of officers to return them to Denver.

The couple are charged with a conspiracy to defraud, it being alleged that they in company with J. Lofton Davidson and Harper H. Orabood, both of Denver, who are now in custody, and Henry W. Diefenbach, who is thought to be in hiding with relatives at Blanco, Colo., had conspired to defraud the Massachusetts Mutual Life Insurance Company, the Knights of Macedonia and the Modern Brotherhood of America, out of insurance to the amount of \$19,000.

Turley and his wife are named as the leading parties in the conspiracy, and in their confession to the Kansas sheriff, told an interesting story. Vall Turley, who bears the distinction of being "the dead man in the case," was supposed to have been cremated at Riverside cemetery, Denver, on the afternoon of September 3, 1915. Turley left Denver on September 1, 1914, on the day his supposed death is said to have taken place in J. Lofton Davidson's automobile on the Golden road, and has spent the time since last September, in Kansas, Nebraska, Iowa and Indiana.

The couple were returned to Denver Tuesday evening.

That in selling said notes to plaintiff said defendant falsely and fraudulently represented that said notes were negotiable instruments. That in the sale of said notes defendant made certain false and fraudulent representations concerning same to plaintiff which representations were relied upon by plaintiff in the purchase of said notes. That said transaction occurred on or about the 18th day of July 1914. That said notes are worthless and are tendered into court for defendants use. That on the 29th day of December 1914 plaintiff filed the necessary affidavit and bond and secured the issuance of an attachment, and garnishee notice against the Webster County Bank. That on the 1st day of February said Webster County Bank, garnishee answered and disclosed that it held \$233.36 open account subject to check in favor of said defendant which amount was by the County Court ordered paid into court to abide the order of the court in said proceeding.

You will take notice that said case is set for hearing in the County Court of Webster County, Nebraska, on the 5th day of April 1915 at ten o'clock in the forenoon and unless you make answer and show cause said amount of \$233.36 will be applied in satisfaction of plaintiffs claim and such other and further action taken in said proceeding as provided by law.
